

Ash Wednesday

The Day of Ashes (Latin: *dies cinerum*), the first day of Lent, probably dates from at least the eighth century. On this day the faithful approach the altar where the priest, dipping his thumb into ashes previously blessed, marks the forehead of each with the sign of the cross, saying as a reminder of our mortality: 'Remember that thou art dust and unto dust thou shalt return.'

The wearing of ashes is also a sign of repentance - for example, in Job 42:6 we read: 'I retract what I have said and repent in dust and ashes.' The ashes are made by burning the blessed palms that were distributed the previous year on Palm Sunday.

THE RISING OF 'THE LIVING DEAD'

The sight of a leper, with bits of skin dangling from one's extremities such as fingers and toes, would easily arouse a range of feelings in most of us, such as compassion, repulse and even anger. A disease which fortunately does not afflict people in twenty first Western society, is sadly still found in parts of the world, just as it was centuries ago deep in the Sinai Peninsula.

Confronted with leprosy, or similar skin conditions, Moses and his leaders decided that such persons were impure, and as such they were banished to live well away from any contact with members of the community. Both the 'impure' man and Jesus knew the rules, but the man in Mark's account seemed quite oblivious to these restrictions. In what could have been interpreted as an act of defiance, he approached Jesus, a definite 'no-no', and as Jesus stood his ground, the faith-filled man let him know that "If you will, you can make me clean."

Already deeply affected by the sight of the 'condemned' man, Jesus was visibly moved with compassion, or, as scholars inform us, he actually showed anger at the injustice which had been perpetrated. "Of course I do, be clean". and in a tangible sign of affection, he touched him. Both men had broken several prescriptions, but neither Jesus nor the man showed the lest bit of concern. What mattered was that the man who had been condemned to be a LIVING-DEAD would now be able to rise to the life which had been denied him.

We may not be so hard on Moses, because excommunications and exclusions continue to blot our otherwise inclusive nature. A woman may not join the bingo group any more, a student is no longer welcome among the select group of friends, people with alternative lifestyles or choices are shunned. We would do well to examine the choices we make.
