#### DID YOU KNOW ??

- Lent lasts for forty days in imitation of Jesus' forty days in the wilderness. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Thursday.
- Each Lent all the baptised are expected to adopt the three Lenten disciplines of Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving to those in need.
- In years gone by, Catholics did not eat meat on any Friday, and later on Fridays in Lent. Today there are two days on the year when we are expected to not eat meat Ash Wednesday and Good Friday but all the Fridays of Lent are still days when we should 'fast'.

## **MASS OF HEALING & ANOINTING**

Wednesday 13th March at 11:00am

there will be a Mass of Healing and Anointing for the Sick and Elderly.

On this First Sunday of Lent, the Church invites us to begin a journey of spiritual renewal with fresh energy and hope.

We journey with Jesus, the one into whom the Spirit of God has come down from heaven. At his baptism by John the Baptist, Jesus was saturated with the Spirit of God as much as his body was by the waters of the river Jordan and was named 'beloved Son", with whom the heavenly Father is well pleased.

Today we see this beloved Son expelled by the heavenly Spirit into the earthly wilderness. Jesus is portrayed as a Jewish man entering into the great formative experience of his people who wandered for forty years in the wilderness before they came into the Promised Land. In these forty days Jesus enters into this same experience of a time apart from regular social life, when his unique relationship with the Father will be consolidated.

Further, in this wild and dangerous place, Jesus is tested by Satan, subjected to the worst Satan can do to him, and he survives. In Jesus we see What humanity can be. So in Jesus` time apart in the wilderness, we see God's vision for human life in a peace-filled, new creation, which Jesus` life death and resurrection will bring about.
