# TRANSFIGURATION

Last week's Gospel story was set in the wilderness. It served to reminds us of the forty years' journey of the Israelites in the desert. Wilderness and mountains are seen as ideal settings where humans meet with the divine. It was on the tallest mountain in the Sinai Peninsula, that Moses received the Ten Commandments, the Law which was to guide the Israelites as people. It was there where God made a covenant with them: He would be their God, and they would be his people. It was to this same mountain that centuries later Elijah returned, and experienced the presence of God in the gentle breeze.

Today's Gospel story is set on another mountain, where we find Jesus, 'the new Moses,' not alone, but in the company of Old Testament Greats: Moses and Elijah, and three key figures from his own company: Peter, James and John. Jesus appears to be on a crossroad: to continue with his ministry or to follow another path. What a setting for such a significant moment! In the presence of significant figures from the past, and three key figures out of his own inner circle out, he makes a momentous decision, knowing full well that if he continues to challenge repression and injustice, he is highly likely to face opposition and even death.

As if to show approval for such a decision, Jesus is seen to be "enveloped in a dazzling white light", while a voice from above was heard declaring, "This is my beloved son. Listen to him". As one, therefore who was nor only to be admired and revered, but one *to be listened to*, to be followed as the one who 'would fulfil the Law and the Prophets.'.

Peter, James and John might have been somewhat confuse up there on the mountain, just as we might have been, but they would definitely remember it after the Resurrection, understand it and proclaim it far and wide.
