



REFLECTION:COUNTER – THE DUAL COMMAND

In this Gospel passage, Jesus does not command us to love 'God'! Speaking to a Jewish audience, he says: 'You shall love the Lord, your God'. That is, very specifically 'the Lord' who had rescued the Jewish people from slavery in Egypt. So, the love which Jesus commands is a responsive love, responding to a relationship already initiated by Divine Love. Don't try to manufacture some emotion of love for God, God in the abstract. First, cast your mind to something for which you can be grateful: perhaps as elementary as your life itself: you may never have been loved into existence; perhaps some particular person or incident which strikes you as an undeserved gift; perhaps for the beauty and grandeur of some aspect of nature which elates you; perhaps some liberation from a situation in which you had seemed to be drowning. Recognising the divine creative Spirit at work in those or a myriad of other ways allows you to be particular and to respond with love with your whole personality: 'Heart, mind, strength, soul'. And then, when we recognise these moments in our lives as moments when God loved us in a particular way, often in a foundational way, we have good reason to love ourselves. After all, if God found us so loveable as to give us the gift of life, of a person, of beauty in creation, of rescue from some engulfing predicament, why shouldn't we love ourselves? We don't have to sign up for some course I self-help or self-esteem. We can love ourselves because God esteems us and God has helped us become more . . . more what? The answer is, the sort of person who can fulfil the command: 'You shall love your neighbour as yourself.' What does

Not simply the negative: 'Don't do to another what would be hateful for yourself', a minimalist starting point. And not some vague commitment to 'changing the world'. In issuing the command, 'You shall love your neighbour as yourself', Jesus the Jew was quoting from the Book of Leviticus, 19:18. In the immediately preceding verses, the Jewish people were instructed not to strip vineyards and orchards bare, but to leave something for the poor. They were instructed not to steal or engage in fraud, nor to exploit labourers who needed their wages. In other words, Jesus had in mind a context of very particular people in very particular situations. That is the way in which we are to demonstrate love for our neighbour. Of course, 'who is our neighbour' must be answered very differently in the 21st century compared with that time of Jesus. We are global citizens in a world without frontiers. The neighbour is clearly much more than the next door neighbour. We are aware as never before of the situation facing people half a world away, and we have the capacity to help in that situation. The neighbour could be in a village in Tanzania! Jesus brought these two decrees from his Jewish tradition and fused them into the one command: 'There is no command greater than these.' This fusion guards us against religious fanaticism which ignores social justice, and political activism which ignores the God dimension. When we try to fulfil the dual command issued by Jesus Christ, we become humane Christians, Christian humanists who may hope to hear Our Lord's words at the end of this Gospel passage: 'You are not far from the Kingdom of God.'
