ST DOMINIC'S IS A CHILD SAFE PARISH

At St Dominic's we hold the care, safety and wellbeing of children and young people as a central and fundamental responsibility of our parish.

JESUS OPENS OUR EYES

The Emmaus story opens with the disciples' confusion and disappointment about the events of Jesus' life and death. "Our own hope had been that...," they tell the stranger who has joined them on the road. Things had not turned out the way they had hoped. They seldom do for us too. The worshiping community will notice the "liturgy" begins with a need for healing "Lord, have mercy". Then it moves to the stranger breaking open God's Word for them, enabling them to see God's plan in what had happened. What follows is



a sacred gesture we will experience ourselves around the altar, "the breaking of the bread." In Luke and then later in Acts, "the breaking of the bread" is a term used for the Eucharist.

It's as if Luke is telling his readers, "do you get it?" The risen Lord is present to us in the celebration of the Eucharist when we gather to receive Christ in his Word and Sacrament. Like the two on the road, we don't get the extraordinary appearances of Christ the disciples in the upper room would have. Nor does Christ appear to us as he did to Thomas, inviting us to touch his wounds. That would be wonderful and life altering. What we have that is also wonderful and life altering, Luke tells us, is that each time we gather to celebrate the great deed God has done in Jesus with joy and gratitude, Jesus is as present to us as he was in the upper room and to the Emmaus travellers.

What fills us with joy and gratitude is Jesus' presence with us – in one another, in the proclamation of the Word of God and in the Eucharist. Just as Jesus entered/interrupted the conversation of the downcast disciples as they journeyed and discussed their broken-hearted and discouraged condition, so we invite him to come into our conversations when we feel defeated or inadequate.

These are the difficult conversations when we: seek reconciliation after a long period of hurt; struggle to guide our children and young people; search for words to explain our faith to an inquirer, or doubter; try to comfort a broken spirit weighed down by guilt, sickness, addiction, exclusion, etc. At times like these we too are on a journey, involved in conversations that matter. We invite Jesus to join us so we can discover him, not just as a memory of long ago, but as a living presence with us, on the road as we travel to the home he has prepared for us by his death and resurrection.

3rd SUNDAY EASTER 2020

Our Gospel today tells us of two disciples, Cleopas and his unnamed companion who, with their hopes in Jesus shattered, leave Jerusalem for Emmaus on the Sunday afternoon following his death. On the way they recount to Jesus, whom they meet on their journey but as yet do not recognise, what had happened over the previous few days. They confide in him that they had been astonished by Mary Magdalene and some other women who said that an angel had declared that Jesus had risen from the dead. The two made it clear that they did not believe what Mary had said about him.

The unrecognised companion then rebuked them: "you foolish men! So slow to believe the full message of the prophets!" The rejection of testimony to Jesus' resurrection seems to have been the universal response amongst his disciples. During his ministry in Galilee he had foretold his death and resurrection and had said "Let these words sink into your ears." But their response was incomprehension.

In contrast, now listening to Jesus the two disciples are able to understand the Scriptures about the suffering Messiah rising from the dead, entering into glory as the Son of Man. Their hearts were on fire "while he was opening the scriptures to them." His death no longer signalled the end of their hopes. They had grasped its meaning.

Nearing Emmaus, Jesus, still unrecognised, accepted their invitation to supper: "Stay with us because it is almost evening and the day is now nearly over." And now we have the climax of the story as the disciples identify Jesus when "he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them," the same four actions of Jesus associated with the feeding of the 5000 in Galilee, "which in Luke's account is immediately followed by Peter's recognition of him as the Messiah," and the same actions associated with Jesus at the Last Supper. In this moment of recognition Jesus is the Bread of life in the Eucharist, completing his feeding of them through teaching them the meaning of Scripture about his death.

The supper at Emmaus has become a subject for many great artists over the centuries. One acknowledged masterly depiction of the scene is that of Caravaggio dating from 1601. He captures the moment of recognition - Jesus' hand raised, blessing the bread - dramatically using light and shade and perspective. Among the painting's subtleties noted by commentators two in particular appeal to me. In the foreground of the painting there is a basket of food close, we might say too close, to the edge of the table. As one critic says, "Like the world that these [two disciples] knew, the basket of food teeters dangerously over the edge of the table." The painting perhaps is saying that it is the risen Jesus who holds things together, stopping them, and ourselves, falling into chaos. There is a fourth person in the painting, the one serving the three at table. He is standing in the background and appears oblivious to the drama that is unfolding before him. Could this not be a subtle warning that I, like him, may fail to enter into the mystery of Jesus' death and resurrection?

In conclusion: Luke's account of the journey to Emmaus gives us much. We have the outline of the Christian understanding of the Old Testament and how it points to Jesus' paschal mystery. Then our evangelist gives us the risen Jesus, our Bread of life through word and Eucharist our companion, though often unrecognized, as each one of us journeys through life. And he who among all the Gospel writers most consistently draws attention to Jesus at prayer has left us the simple and striking prayer of Cleopas and his companion, "Stay with us Lord, since evening is approaching," a prayer that is answered in the gifts of Word and Sacraments, especially the Eucharist.

WELCOMING THE STRANGER REPORT.

At present the parish is supporting a Pakistani family with 3 children (15 years, 12 and 10) with accommodation in Dandenong. All three children go to local Catholic schools. The father



arrived by boat on Christmas island in 2012. After being in detention for a number of years he has been granted a 5 year Safe Haven Enterprise Visa (Shev). Because of ill health he cannot work and his wife is looking for employment – not easy in the present situation. They survive with your support and help from the local SVdP conference in Dandenong.
