"UNLESS YOU REPENT YOU WILL ALL PERISH"

3rd Sunday of Lent, Year C

23rd/24th March 2019

When disasters happen, whether created by people or nature, we tend to learn lessons from them and realize how fragile our existence is. Jesus indicates that the victims did nothing wrong, nothing from them that caused their death. We should not mistake their death was God's punishment, or our good fortune as

evidence of God's award. When things go wrong, they are signs to us to reflect on our lives and asks ourselves whether we are producing the fruit that is asked of us. Confronting the suddenness of death and the unpredictability of life, Jesus does not promise a life free of calamity but urges his hearers against false self-assurances. By raising the guestion "Do you suppose that these Galileans who suffered like that were worse sinners than any other



Galileans?", Jesus points out that we suffer because of our own sin, the sin of others and living in a sin cursed world. If life's fragility demands urgency, that urgency shows that life itself has carved out opportunity for us to seize God's graciousness, as the fig tree parable suggests. He concludes by giving a warning that without repentance that they were subject to likewise perish.

Repentance does not keep you from dying physically, but it is the first step in receiving spiritual life so that you will not perish eternally. Repentance is a change of mind that results in a change of action. If there is not a change of life, then there was no change of mind, there was no repentance and no faith.

The fig tree parable illustrates God's patience with people and the nature of repentance. Jesus has taught and given hope in God's offer of forgiveness through faith in His Son who was standing in



front of them. God's patience is seen in the vineyard-keeper's intervention. He knows that figs usually respond well to fertilizer, so he proposes that the tree be left alone one more year during which where's the *Pruit*? he would dig around it and spread lots of manure. He has some optimism this will help and it will

produce in which case it would be worth keeping. He will have done all that he could, but it will have proven itself to be a worthless tree and therefore subject to destruction at any time.

We are asked to be more sensitive to the needs of our world and of each other. We are asked to build a better place to live, and to support those who are struggle in any way.
