Social Justice Sunday - Homelessness

On these cold, wet, wintry nights it is very confronting to see and to hear of people sleeping in the streets as more than a thousand Victorians do on any one night. Across Australia besides those sleeping rough, others sleep in cars, on couches, in over- crowded homes, in short term crisis shelters, rehabilitation and correction centres. The number of people affected has increased significantly in the past five years; estimates indicate 116, 000 people on any one night, with an increase in the number of calls for assistance, many of which go unanswered. Homelessness is not just confined to the major cities. Regional areas are also affected.

How do we explain this phenomenon of the unavailability of secure and stable housing for so many people in affluent Australia when access to safe and secure housing is considered to be both a basic human need and a human right? The causes are often complex involving factors such as the lack of affordable housing, increasing rental costs, unemployment, inadequate welfare payments, family and domestic disability, addiction and people leaving custody. Those most affected are young people, asylum seekers, aborigines and Torres Strait Islanders and increasingly women over 55.

Living in poverty, experiencing family breakdown, wishing to avoid state care, suffering from mental illness, coming from a non

- English speaking background, or living in rural and remote locations - all can lead to homelessness for young people. Furthermore, those with jobs are on often on low incomes which do not enable them to afford rent.



Domestic violence within Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities is a major factor associated with homelessness. For all victims of domestic violence access to safe and secure housing is a prerequisite for breaking the cycle of violence. Older women, ineligible for an aged pension, with inadequate savings, trying to survive on the Newstart allowance are often unable to pay private rental.

Awareness of the serious long term effects of homelessness on the health and wellbeing of individual people and on the social, cultural and economic life of the community is leading to a demand for a National Strategy involving state and federal governments and civil society to confront homelessness. In January this year the Andrews Government allocated \$45 million for its Homelessness and Rough Sleeping Action Plan designed to increase social housing and improve support and outreach services for vulnerable Victorians.

What can Individuals do? Raise our voices to encourage the Government to take action and address the rising homelessness. As an aid to greater awareness, watch the SBS series: "Filthy Rich and Homeless", or buy a copy of the "Big Issue".


