# Missionary Immersion Trip 2019

#### Friday 4th January 2019: arrive 15.30 at Manila

On arrival at Manila, the group will be met by Fr Hector Attard mssp and will transfer by private bus to the Missionary Society of St Paul's (MSSP) International House of Formation (IHF), Quezon City, Manila. Group will be introduced to the brothers and priests and settle into their accommodation. The Paulist community living at the International House of Formation come from a variety of different countries, including Peru, Pakistan, Malta, the Philippines and Vietnam.

## Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> January:

7.30 am: Breakfast

**8.30 am** – Stroll down 13<sup>th</sup> Street. MSSP provide ministry to the people who live in slums on 13th Street. These men, women and children live in extremely impoverished surroundings in shantytown conditions. A number of the children of 13th St are provided with scholarships by the MSSP to ensure that they are able to continue their education and the adults are provided with pastoral formation.

9.00 - 11.00 Activities/catechesis with the children from  $13^{th}$  Street at the IHF. Today we will be responsible for the catechism lessons to these children. We need to prepare topics / activities to share with them.

11.00 am - Merienda (morning tea)

11.30 am - 12.30 pm Mass - IHF Chapel

12.30 pm - 1.30 pm Lunch

**1.30 pm – 6.00 pm** The group will spend the afternoon exploring the sights of Manila, offering a glimpse into the life of the locals, and seeing both past and present Manila. The group will visit the Minor Basilica of the Black Nazarene (known colloquially as Quiapo Church) which is famous home for the shrine of the Black Nazarene. Following this we will explore Manila's historic Intramuros area where we will learn about the Spanish colonial period and discover the intricate Baroque architectural designs of UNESCO World Heritage-listed San Agustin Church.

**10.15** – **lunchtime** – Merienda and then gathering with the MSSP Lay Community: this might involve splitting up the group into various age groups, and, together with the MSSP Lay Community, a sharing and discussion of the Gospel.

# Monday 7th January

**9.00 am** - Visit the (Mother Teresa of Culcutta) Missionaries of Charity Sisters' Home of Joy for the Sick Children in Tayuman, Manila. The orphanage was established as a special place which caters for disabled and underprivileged children. The group will assist the staff and other volunteers (including nurses and doctors) with household and personal care tasks (such as feeding) and also will be able to interact with the toddlers and children.

Visit to the Mount Samat National Shrine, an historical shrine located near the summit of Mount Samat in the town of Pilár in the province of Bataan. This memorial shrine complex was built to honour and remember the gallantry of Filipino and American soldiers who fought during the World War II.

# Wed 16<sup>th</sup> January

Leave Subic and return to Manila – on the way back to Manila, we visit the famous Buried Church - San Guillermo Parish Church. Named after San Guillermo, the patron saint of Bacolor Pampanga where the church is erected, the church was originally constructed by the Augustinian Friars in 1576. In 1880, the church was then destroyed by an earthquake only to be rebuilt again in 1886. In 1995, lahar flow from the slopes of Mount Pinatubo buried the church at half its 12-metre height. The original door, which has been buried by mud and ash materials, can no longer be seen. Its old convent has now been converted to an art gallery, the Museo de Bacolor.
