Below we make special mention of Ivan Sheahan as he was a special part of our parish for a long time.

## Ivan Sheahan - 18.8.1926 - 8.11.2014

Parishioner of St John's Heidelberg for all of his 88 years and 82 days. Ivan was regarded by many as "an elder statesman of the Parish". There was no denying his honesty and directness.

A sentence in the gospel reading from Ivan's Funeral Mass could easily have been his motto for life, "trust in God still and trust in me". Such was Ivan's faithfulness, his dedication to family, to the parish and whatever else he took on. We recall particularly in later life Ivan was there when something was to be fixed or work done, especially around St John's.

Ivan was born in Templestowe when it was part of St John's parish, baptised at St John's, attended St Monica's school (later St John's) received all the Sacraments at St John's including those of his wedding to Josie and finally the Rite of Burial. He certainly was a

Ivan's family ran a Templestowe hotel. The family moved to Heidelberg when Ivan was five living first in Brown Street, then Hawdon Street. After finishing secondary school at Parade College East Melbourne (probably having gained what was known in those times as the Merit Certificate, grade 8) Ivan commenced an apprenticeship as a wood turner/cabinet maker at Rouch's timber and hardware in Burgundy St reet on the site which is now Leo's Supermarket. Ivan was at Rouch's for 27 years, until it closed in 1970. The following 17 years were spent working with Sidney Cooke Fasteners.

Ivan and Josie Hogan married in 1952, living in the Hogan family home at 57 Cape Street, the double storey home next to St Monica's Hall (formerly the school), until Ivan finished building the family home at 5 Weyburn Court. Ivan and Josie raised 8 children.

The envy of many was Ivan's workshop where he spent time putting his trade skills to use, particularly in retirement. He was so generous in assisting many, including at St John's, mending, improving or repairing whatever needed to be done. His legacy remains in many handrails on doors of the church to assist the elderly, wheels he placed on the baptismal font, a font in which Ivan and Josie's own children and grandchildren were baptised.

Other than his family and parish, Ivan's other great interest was Heidelberg Football Club which he served for many years both as a player and administrator. He was awarded Life Memberships of both the Football Club and the Diamond Valley Football League. Ivan was known to look after some of the young players by putting them up for the night. Boys who were best described as "tired" after a rugged match, but more honestly were "legless" and best not seen by parents... another example of his kindness.

Ivan was farewelled in a packed church at St John's with those unable to be inside the church seated in front of a big screen in the parish hall.

We will miss Ivan Sheahan. Rest in Peace.
