Dear parishioners, visitors and friends,

The gospel story today speaks about another wedding feast: ten maidens have the duty to wait for the bridegroom to return from the bride's family home, together with his new bride. Since they do not know at what time the bridegroom would be returning, they had to be prepared.

The maidens take with them oil lamps to give them light. Some of the maidens wisely also took with them extra oil, just in case the bridegroom delayed and they ran out of oil. Others were foolish and did not think ahead.

Like the maidens we too are invited to be prepared. We are invited to stay awake and not let the daily chores of our life to distract us. Our role is to stay focused on the coming of the bridegroom. In our Baptism we are given a burning candle to represent the flame of our faith and we are told to protect this flame and to keep it burning till the end.

Like the wise maidens we need to make sure that we have enough oil in our lamps so that they do not run out. What is the oil we put into our lamps? One way to strengthen our faith is to reach out to our sisters and brothers in acts of love and charity. Our faith needs to lead us into helping those around us, especially those who are less fortunate then us.

Pope Francis constantly reminds us that the best place to meet Jesus is in the poor around us. Jesus reminds us that we are blessed when we see him hungry or thirsty and look after him, or see him sick or in prison and we go to visit him. These acts of charity help us to stay awake and to learn how to look out for Jesus in our daily life.

So stay awake because you do not know either the day or the hour when the Son of Man will come and we need to be prepared to go out and meet him when he arrives.

May God continue to bless us all.
