A Very Blessed Christmas

Dear parishioners, visitors and friends,

'God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.' (John 3:16)

This is the good news that we celebrate tomorrow. God himself looks at our humanity and decides that our life and culture is good enough for him to share with us. God came and pitched his tent

among us (Jn 1:14); God lives our own life, he is Emmanuel, God-with-us.

The great significance of this event is that God actually knows what it feels like to be human; with us and like us he laughed and suffered. Like us Jesus was fully human and participated fully in everything that makes us human, thus consecrating our life so that when we live our life we ourselves share in the very life of God. In the words of Bishop St Athanasius (c. 296–373), one of the Church Fathers, 'God became human so that we humans might become God.'

Our whole life, the culture we have created and live in, has been deified, it is in the image and likeness of God himself. I therefore have to walk this life gently and carefully as I walk always in the presence of the divine. I do have a duty to respect the environment I live in as it holds within it the presence of God. I need to constantly remind myself that God is alive in each of my sisters and brothers and in everything that is around me. This is how I experience the face of God every day.

As I celebrate Christmas this year, as I stop to meditate in front of the cute image of the weak and fragile child sitting in the manger, I remind myself that whenever I touch anything that is around me, I touch the very face of God. Christmas once again reminds me that God is with me at every stage of my life.

When we wish each other a Happy Christmas this year, let us wish each other that we see God's face every day of our life.


