Dear Parishioners, Friends and Visitors

Happy Easter!

For us who believe in Jesus as Son of God, Easter is the greatest event in humanity and the most important celebration in the whole year.

On Christmas day we celebrated God's great love for us women and men when God chose to be born as one of us so that we could enter into relationship with him. Jesus is the visible face of the invisible God!

Jesus continuously spoke about the Father's great love and mercy. We have beautiful parables and teachings that remind us of this love. Jesus also said that he was The Way, The Truth and The Life. Since Jesus spoke in the name of the Father, the Jewish leaders thought he was blaspheming. A number of times they tried to get rid of him by throwing him off a cliff or by stoning him, but Jesus always managed to get away from them as his hour had not yet come.

After he gave up himself to his disciples as spiritual food and drink at the Last Supper, he gave himself up on the cross. Jesus could have easily avoided dying on the cross, but by giving up his life for us he showed us how great is God's love for us.

The Easter celebration tells us that Jesus' story does not end on the cross. Jesus died as a human, but as a God he can never die; he rose again to show us that God is powerful even over death.

We grieve and cry when we have to let go of our loved ones in death, but the passion, death and resurrection story invites us to believe that our physical death is not the end. Jesus is risen! He is alive! And like him we too will rise and live in God.

When things hit rock bottom around us, we need to look up at the cross and remind ourselves of this great victory:

Christ is Risen! He is Lord! Alleluia!
