Dear parishioners, visitors and friends,

MERRY CHRISTMAS!

This Tuesday we celebrate the great feast of Christmas. Our focus will go on the cute young child lying in the manger. In our parish we have the beautiful tradition of having a child and his (or her) parents stand-in for Mary, Joseph and the child Jesus. Personally I find this a very significant aspect of our celebration as it reminds me what the child Jesus, God made human for us, looked like in the hands of Mary and her husband Joseph.

Christmas is a great celebration as it brings to fulfilment the plan God had for us long ago. Out of love, God created us; created us in his own image and likeness. This means that God placed in us something of himself. (I imagine God as being a light of great brilliance and myself to have within me a small flame, a part of God's brilliance) In order for us to be able to grow fully into this image of God, God chose to show himself to us. God does this firstly through creation around us; when we look at creation we can wonder and marvel about the creator of all! Then he shows us himself through his relationship with the people of Israel whose story is narrated in the books of the Old Testament. Finally, at the fullness of time, God chose to speak his full an final word in Jesus, the Word of God made flesh for us.

This young child in the manger is the face and voice of God for us. God did not come down in our midst as an impressive giant, superhero or great warrior king with a strong army; he came to us in the humility of a simple child. Through the simplicity of this young child, God wishes to attract us and invite to enter into a faith relationship with him.

In Bethlehem Mary placed her new-born child in a manger—a feeding trough for animals. Even at his birth Jesus invites us to approach him and feed on him, he is food for us. We can look at ourselves as being a humble manger where Jesus can be born in our daily life and in the life of our family today. As a feeding trough, we too can be open to offer Jesus to those around us and to the world. We can offer Jesus to our partners, children in our family, friends and work mates. Like the manger in Bethlehem, we can hold Jesus up to the world to engage with. In order for us to be able to offer Jesus to the world, we need to be ready to receive him first. We need to empty ourselves of the business and concerns of life and welcome Jesus once again in our lives this Christmas.

I hope and pray for all of us that this Christmas we once again engage with the God who came to live in our midst—'set up tent among us'—as the gospel of John so nicely puts it! God gave us himself as the greatest gift of all, let us also reach out to be God to those around us. May God bless us all this Christmas and may God's blessings travel with us as we start a new and blessed year 2019! FIRST READING

Micah 5: 1-4.

The Lord says this: You, Bethlehem Ephrathah, the least of the clans of Judah, out of you will be born for me the one who is to rule over Israel; his origin goes back to the distant past, to the days of old. The Lord is therefore going to abandon them till the time when she who is to give birth gives birth. Then the remnant of his brothers will come back to the sons of Israel. He will stand and feed his flock with the power of the Lord, with the majesty of the name of his God. They will live secure, for from then on he will extend his power to the ends of the land. He himself will be peace.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM *Psalm 79: 2-3. 15-16, 18-19*

TOGETHER: Lord, make us turn to you; let us see your face and we shall be saved.

LEFT SIDE (AMBO SIDE)

O Shepherd of Israel, hear us, shine forth from your cherubim throne. O Lord, rouse up your might, O Lord, come to our help.

RIGHT SIDE (PRIEST'S SIDE)

God of hosts, turn again, we implore, look down from heaven and see. Visit this vine and protect it, the vine your right hand has planted.

LEFT SIDE (PRIEST'S SIDE)

May your hand be on the man you have chosen, the man you have given your strength. And we shall never forsake you again: give us life that we may call upon your name.

TOGETHER: Lord, make us turn to you; let us see your face and we shall be saved.

Second Reading

Hebrews 10:5-10.

This is what Christ said, on coming into the world: You who wanted no sacrifice or oblation, prepared a body for me. You took no pleasure in holocausts or sacrifices for sin; then I said, just as I was commanded in the scroll of the book, God, here I am! I am coming to obey your will.'

Notice that he says first: You did not want what the Law lays down as the things to be offered, that is: the sacrifices, the oblations, the holocausts and the sacrifices for sin, and you took no pleasure in them; and then he says: Here I am! I am coming to obey your will. He is abolishing the first sort to replace it with the second. And this will was for us to be made holy by the offering of his body made once and for all by Jesus Christ.

I am the servant of the Lord: may his will for me be done.

GOSPEL

Luke 1:39-45.

Mary set out and went as quickly as she could to a town in the hill country of Judah. She went into Zechariah's house and greeted Elizabeth. Now as soon as Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leapt in her womb and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. She gave a loud cry and said, 'Of all women you are the most blessed, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. Why should I be honoured with a visit from the mother of my Lord? For the moment your greeting reached my ears, the child in my womb leapt for joy. Yes, blessed is she who believed that the promise made her by the Lord would be fulfilled.'

BLESSED IS SHE WHO BELIEVED

Today's Gospel brings us to the threshold of Jesus' birth. Presuming our knowledge of the Annunciation to Mary, it describes the meeting between Mary and her cousin, Elizabeth. In this 'Visitation' story, the two women share their remarkable experience, and faith overflows in new insight, knowledge and celebration.

Mary has surrendered in faith to the extraordinary role that Gabriel has announced to her. In faith, too, she has obeyed the angel's additional command to go and seek out the 'sign' consisting in the pregnancy of her elderly cousin. Biblical faith does not presuppose signs already given; it acts, goes on its journey, and then discovers confirmatory signs. This is how Elizabeth's pregnancy functions for Mary. The lesser wonder brought about by God's power (the conception of a child to parents of advanced years) confirms her faith in the far greater marvel: that with God's Spirit taking the role of male parent she is to become the mother of her people's Messiah.

As soon as she hears Mary's greeting, Elizabeth experiences within her womb the infant John leaping with joy. Already he is beginning his role of pointing to the Messiah. Hence Elizabeth confirms what Mary has hitherto simply believed: that she is indeed pregnant with the Messiah whose role and destiny Gabriel had announced.

Elizabeth insists that Mary is 'blessed,' not simply because she is 'the mother of my Lord,' but in her believing ('Blessed is she who believed'). As supremely in her case, faith is the channel through which God's power flows into the world.
