Dear Parishioners, Visitors and Friends,

THE CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION

In the Church community we have three sacraments of initiation that introduce us into our community: Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. Some of us may be aware that in certain traditions (rites) Baptism and Confirmation are celebrated as one sacrament at birth. For others, while Baptism is celebrated at birth, what has been given at Baptism is confirmed by the Bishop (or his representative) at Confirmation, usually received in Year Six of the primary school.

The celebration of the sacraments is a very important moment, not only for the individual and the family, but for the whole parish community. It is a moment when we come together to welcome new members in our midst or celebrate with them the milestones in their life. Whenever possible, the celebration of the sacraments is done in a way that involves the parish community. When we celebrate the sacraments of Confirmation, Eucharist and Reconciliation, candidates are introduced to the community and before they start their preparation for the sacraments.

At the sacrament of Confirmation, when the bishop or his representative visits the parish, he also confirms the life and the ministry that happens in the parish. The sacrament of Confirmation expresses the connection of the life in the parish with the life of the whole church, represented in the bishop.

Over the past number of years, since we have not have a suitable venue that caters for the numbers, we have not been able to express this link with our bishop. Often we have had to use venues outside our parish for the celebration of Confirmation. We are grateful that since 2016, Our Lady of Mercy College have been sharing with us, their sacred space in the Nalleijerring Centre. Every year, as a parish, we have been using this space for our Christmas Vigil, Good Friday and First Communion celebrations.

It is now time for us to start celebrating the sacrament of Confirmation also in this space. Apart from the opportunity for the bishop to visit our parish on a yearly basis, as he is expected to do, this change brings with it other advantages. The space is more familiar, bringing us all closer to the altar where the celebration happens and it also means that we do not have to battle the traffic and parking issues we face, each time we go into the city. From past experience, we know that the Nalleijerring Centre is very appropriate for these types of family and parish celebrations and is a big enough space for us to be able to invite all our family and friends.

From 2020 the Sacrament of Confirmation will be celebrated in the Nalleijerring Centre. Moreover, from 2020, as part of the preparation for the sacrament of Confirmation, Year Six students will be participating in a visit to St Patrick's Cathedral.

I trust that this move will allow us to continue celebrating the life and sacraments of our parish to the best of our abilities.

Listen to this, you who trample on the needy and try to suppress the poor people of the country, you who say, 'When will New Moon be over so that we can sell our corn, and sabbath, so that we can market our wheat? Then by lowering the bushel, raising the shekel, by swindling and tampering with the scales, we can buy up the poor for money, and the needy for a pair of sandals, and get a price even for the sweepings of the wheat.' The Lord swears it by the pride of Jacob, 'Never will I forget a single thing you have done.'

SECOND READING

1 Timothy 2:1-8

My advice is that, first of all, there should be prayers offered for everyone — petitions, intercessions and thanksgiving — and especially for kings and others in authority, so that we may be able to live religious and reverent lives in peace and quiet. To do this is right, and will please God our saviour: he wants everyone to be saved and reach full knowledge of the truth. For there is only one God, and there is only one mediator between God and mankind, himself a man, Christ Jesus, who sacrificed himself as a ransom for them all. He is the evidence of this, sent at the appointed time, and I have been named a herald and apostle of it and — I am telling the truth and no lie — a teacher of the faith and the truth to the pagans.

In every place, then, I want the men to lift their hands up reverently in prayer, with no anger or argument.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

Alleluia, alleluia!

Jesus Christ was rich but he became poor, to make you rich out of his poverty.

Alleluia!

GOSPEL *Luke 16:10-13*

Jesus said to his disciples: 'The man who can be trusted in little things can be trusted in great; the man who is dishonest in little things will be dishonest in great. If then you cannot be trusted with money, that tainted thing, who will trust you with genuine riches? And if you cannot be trusted with what is not yours, who will give you what is your very own?

'No servant can be the slave of two masters: he will either hate the first and love the second, or treat the first with respect and the second with scorn. You cannot be the slave both of God and of money.'

ENSURING A WELCOME

In what way exactly was the manager in the parable we hear today 'dishonest?'

We might think that it had to do with what he does with his master's creditors—getting them to write down reduced amounts of what they owe? Yet the master finds fault with the manager *before* he has recourse to this stratagem.

By reducing the amounts owed, the manager was not defrauding his master but stripping away the commission he himself would normally (and legitimately) earn in transacting his master's business. He acts against his own immediate interest to ensure that in the future, when he is out of work and needy, he will have the goodwill of people and a welcome into their homes. He 'buys' their goodwill and, in this respect at least, earns his master's praise.

The parable presupposes the great reversal connected with the coming of the Kingdom as proclaimed by Jesus. In this reversal, 'the hungry will be filled with good things and the rich sent empty away' (Luke 1:53). In light of this reversal the steward's behaviour is somehow exemplary. Rogue he may be (a 'child of this world'), but in taking vigorous action in view of a coming crisis, he shows himself 'more shrewd' than 'the children of light.'

With so much more at stake (eternal life), the wealthy among the children of light would be well advised to strip themselves of their wealth now in order to win friends among the poor. When the poor have their privileged places in the Kingdom, these same poor will welcome them into 'eternal dwellings.'
