Dear Parishioners, Visitors and Friends,

This Sunday we celebrate Mission Sunday. Well, actually, for us Christians, every day of the year is Mission Sunday. Through our Baptism have been born again in Christ and called forth to proclaim the good news that God has saved us, and invites us to live his life here on earth, and in the resurrection.

Mission Sunday is declared and celebrated by the Church in the whole world so that, at least once a year, we can stop and remind ourselves of our duty to live our Baptism through our witness. Pope Francis reminds us that we all have a mission.

The word 'mission' is derived from the Latin word 'missio,' which translates as 'I send.' We are all sent to different mission fields, depending on our calling. For many among us mission is near at home. Many are called to give witness in their family, among friends and at their place of work. We are all called to witness to our belief that God himself became one like us—in all things but sin!—in order to act as the bridge uniting us to God! This indeed is good news!

Some are called to a different mission, accepting the call to be catechists, teachers, spiritual authors, theologians and preachers. After people are inspired to put their faith in this saving God, they need to learn about this loving merciful God. This is the role of those who teach and help those who believe to deepen their faith relationship with God.

Others are called to travel to foreign countries. We are aware that not all people have heard about the Jesus story, while other peoples have been baptised and live as Christians, but do not have teachers to lead them in their faith. We call this type of mission 'ad gentes'—'to the nations.' This group of missionaries often seek the assistance of the rest of the faith community to support them through prayer, materially and financially.

In our parish we have been helping missionaries witness to the gospel through our monthly gold coin collections. This money has been forwarded to assist missionaries in their work. Earlier this year we have also welcomed the Jose De Piro Kabataan Orkestra from the Philippines, another project reaching out and witnessing to the good news. In January 2019, and again in January 2020, a group of parishioners, together with parishioners from Hoppers Crossing North and from North Sunshine, will be participating in a missionary experience to give witness and to experience for themselves how the faith community reaches out to people in need in the Philippines.

This Mission Sunday our parish faith community will be blessing and sending forth seven members of our parish who will form part of this mission immersion experience in January 2020. Among this group are three young adults (ages: 14 to 17). I invite you to support these parishioners in prayer. We can also support our young adults financially, helping them cover the expenses incurred in this experience.

Exodus 17:8-13

The Amalekites came and attacked Israel at Rephidim. Moses said to Joshua, 'Pick out men for yourself, and tomorrow morning march out to engage Amalek. I, meanwhile, will stand on the hilltop, the staff of God in my hand.' Joshua did as Moses told him and marched out to engage Amalek, while Moses and Aaron and Hur went up to the top of the hill. As long as Moses kept his arms raised, Israel had the advantage; when he let his arms fall, the advantage went to Amalek. But Moses arms grew heavy, so they took a stone and put it under him and on this he sat, Aaron and Hur supporting his arms, one on one side, one on the other; and his arms remained firm till sunset. With the edge of the sword Joshua cut down Amalek and his people.

The Lord will guard your going and coming both now and for ever.

SECOND READING

2 Timothy 3:25-4:2

You must keep to what you have been taught and know to be true; remember who your teachers were, and how, ever since you were a child, you have known the holy scriptures — from these you can learn the wisdom that leads to salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All scripture is inspired by God and can profitably be used for teaching, for refuting error, for guiding people's lives and teaching them to be holy. This is how the man who is dedicated to God becomes fully equipped and ready for any good work.

Before God and before Christ Jesus who is to be judge of the living and the dead, I put this duty to you, in the name of his Appearing and of his kingdom: proclaim the message and, welcome or unwelcome, insist on it. Refute falsehood, correct error, call to obedience – but do all with patience and with the intention of teaching.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

Alleluia, alleluia!

The word of God is living and active;

it probes the thoughts and motives of our heart Alleluia!

GOSPEL Luke 18:1-8

Jesus told his disciples a parable about the need to pray continually and never lose heart. 'There was a judge in a certain town' he said 'who had neither fear of God nor respect for man. In the same town there was a widow who kept on coming to him and saying, "I want justice from you against my enemy!" For a long time he refused, but at last he said to himself, "Maybe I have neither fear of God nor respect for man, but since she keeps pestering me I must give this widow her just rights, or she will persist in coming and worry me to death."'

And the Lord said, 'You notice what the unjust judge has to say? Now will not God see justice done to his chosen who cry to him day and night even when he delays to help them? I promise you, he will see justice done to them, and done speedily. But when the Son of Man comes, will he find any faith on earth?'

THE PERSISTENT CRY FOR JUSTICE

The parable in the gospel for today commends praying to God with the kind of persistence shown by the widow in her dealings with the unjust judge. It does not mean that God, unwilling to respond, needs to be worn down like the judge. Rather, it commends an attitude of trust in God that motivates persistence in prayer, even when an answer may seem a long time coming.

In Jesus' society, widows were dependent on the sound working of the justice system since they lacked the support of a husband and possibly that of adult sons. Hence the plight of this woman, whose entreaties the judge so long ignores. As Jesus tells the story, the judge stirs himself on her behalf only when he suspects that she is going to become physically violent. Translated literally, what the judge says is '... lest she come and give me a black eye' (the Greek expression actually comes from the boxing arena).

The force of the parable flows from a kind of contrasting logic. If the unjust judge moves at long last to grant justice to the widow, albeit through base and self-serving motives, how much more readily and certainly will the God of all goodness move to grant justice to those who make appeal day and night?

In a world where the poor, like the widow, cry out for justice, the challenge of the parable is sharp. Those who actions or inertia allow many to suffer must reckon with a God firmly aligned with the cause of the poor.
