Dear Parishioners, Friends and Visitors,

NOVEL CORONAVIRUS / COVID-19 UPDATE

We are living in strange and unprecedented times. There is no event in living memory that can compare to what we are going through now. The last similar event was a hundred years ago, in 1920, with the Spanish Influenza. While there is no need to panic, we do need to take necessary measures to protect ourselves and our loved ones. Strange and unprecedented events require new, strange and unprecedented responses!

As you are aware, it has been announced that gatherings of more than 100 people are no longer possible. The bishops in Victoria have asked us to stop celebrating Mass and other celebrations, in public, with immediate effect. It is essential that we, as a faith community, are aware of, and comply with, all government and health protocols. We are aware that all this is a source of deep sadness to the faith-filled People of God in our parish and all over the world. Sunday without Eucharist is unthinkable, especially as we approach this most sacred time of Easter.

We need to remind ourselves that even when we cannot participate in Mass at Church, God is still with us. This is NOT a punishment from God. God travels and suffers with us even in these difficult moments. Now is a time to turn to God in prayer. Let us pray for each other, continuously. Let us pray especially for those who are most vulnerable. I invite you to think laterally and come up with creative solutions as to how we can together live through faithfully this time. Elderly members of our community, and people who are struggling financially, are going to be in very serious difficulties as we will not always be able to reach out to them as much as we would like to. How can we be God to other members in the community at these times?

Mass can no longer be celebrated in public, yet our parish church will remain open as usual from 7:30am to 5:00pm. You are welcome to come and spend time in prayer. I will continue to celebrate Mass in private, and offer prayers for you, on a daily basis. You are welcome to send me your personal prayer intentions. We will make an effort to live-stream Mass on the parish facebook page. I will continue to post my Sunday reflections on the parish web page, on our facebook page and by email, I will also try to do this on a daily basis. Parts of the newsletter will also continue to be published. You can also follow Mass and other prayers on the internet, there are some links at the end of this letter. I am aware that many of us do not use the internet. I invite you all to try to reach out to each other and help each other live through these most difficult times. Please let us know if there are ways we can help.

During this time, I will be available for anyone who would like to come to the parish house for Reconciliation, spiritual direction, a chat over a cup of tea or coffee, or Communion. You are also welcome to come and take Communion to elderly relatives at homes or in aged care facilities. I am also available to visit the sick and administer the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick wherever necessary. TWO RESPONSES TO THE LIGHT

Today's gospel describes a perfect drama in eight scenes. The man's blindness is cured right at the start, in the opening scene. But his 'journey to the light' in this physical sense becomes a symbol of a much longer journey: a journey out of the 'darkness' of unbelief to faith in Jesus as the 'Light of the world'.

Jesus in fact appears only at the beginning and end of the drama. In between, the healed man—and his parents—engage in a battle with religious authorities, who constantly pressure him to deny the truth of what Jesus has done for him. Their intensifying hostility, however, only serves to propel him on a journey of ever growing faith that comes to a climax when he falls down and worships Jesus.

As the story develops, the man's character emerges. Questioned about Jesus, he never goes beyond the evidence; he simply sticks to the facts and draws conclusions about Jesus as they are forced upon him. His journey into faith is a journey into ever deeper perception of reality.

The adversaries, on the other hand, resort to denial of the obvious facts, then to unfounded accusations and personal abuse. Finally, they appeal simply to their own authority and status. While the man comes to the Light, they, despite their physical sightedness, journey to the darkness of sin and unreality.

Going in opposite directions, the two journeys dramatically illustrate two responses to Jesus, the Light of the world.

1 Samuel 16:1. 10-13

The Lord said to Samuel, 'Fill your horn with oil and go. I am sending you to Jesse of Bethlehem, for I have chosen myself a king among his sons.' When Samuel arrived, he caught sight of Eliab and thought, 'Surely the Lord's anointed one stands there before him,' but the Lord said to Samuel, 'Take no notice of his appearance or his height for I have rejected him; God does not see as man sees; man looks at appearances but the Lord looks at the heart.' Jesse presented his seven sons to Samuel, but Samuel said to Jesse, 'The Lord has not chosen these.' He then asked Jesse, 'Are these all the sons you have?' He answered, 'There is still one left, the youngest; he is out looking after the sheep.' Then Samuel said to Jesse, 'Send for him; we will not sit down to eat until he comes.' Jesse had him sent for, a boy of fresh complexion, with fine eyes and pleasant bearing. The Lord said, 'Come, anoint him, for this is the one.' At this, Samuel took the horn of oil and anointed him where he stood with his brothers; and the spirit of the Lord seized on David and stayed with him from that day on.

SECOND READING Ephesians 5:8-14

You were darkness once, but now you are light in the Lord; be like children of light, for the effects of the light are seen in complete goodness and right living and truth. Try to discover what the Lord wants of you, having nothing

to do with the futile works of darkness but exposing them by contrast. The things which are done in secret are things that people are ashamed even to speak of; but anything exposed by the light will be illuminated and anything illuminated turns into light. That is why it is said: Wake up from your sleep, rise from the dead, and Christ will shine on you.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

Glory to you, Word of God, Lord Jesus Christ! I am the light of the world, says the Lord; whoever follows me will have the light of life. Glory to you, Word of God, Lord Jesus Christ!

GOSPEL

John 9: 6-9.13-17.34-38

As Jesus went along, he saw a man who had been blind from birth. He spat on the ground, made a paste with the spittle, put this over the eyes of the blind man and said to him, 'Go and wash in the Pool of Siloam' (a name that means 'sent'). So the blind man went off and washed himself, and came away with his sight restored.

His neighbours and people who earlier had seen him begging said, 'Isn't this the man who used to sit and beg?' Some said, 'Yes, it is the same one.' Others said, 'No, he only looks like him.' The man himself said, 'I am the man.'

They brought the man who had been blind to the Pharisees. It had been a sabbath day when Jesus made the paste and opened the man's eyes, so when the Pharisees asked him how he had come to see, he said, 'He put a paste on my eyes, and I washed, and I can see.' Then some of the Pharisees said, 'This man cannot be from God: he does not keep the sabbath.' Others said, 'How could a sinner produce signs like this?' And there was disagreement among them. So they spoke to the blind man again, 'What have you to say about him yourself, now that he has opened your eyes?' 'He is a prophet' replied the man.

'Are you trying to teach us,' they replied 'and you a sinner through and through, since you were born!' And they drove him away.

Jesus heard they had driven him away, and when he found him he said to him, 'Do you believe in the Son of Man?' 'Sir,' the man replied 'tell me who he is so that I may believe in him.' Jesus said, 'You are looking at him; he is speaking to you.' The man said, 'Lord, I believe', and worshipped him.
