Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The Lord is Risen! He is risen indeed! I do hope this is a blessed Easter for you and your family. It's the greatest and most holy days of the church's year. Though it interestingly pales a little bit compared to the prominence we give to Christmas. Especially in society more generally. Unfortunately, the downplaying of Easter is an attitude that has crept into the lives of most Christians too. One of the great markers of a person or family drifting from the faith is when they go camping or on some other trip over the Easter long weekend. The beginning of the end.

I remember many years back a group of mates wanting to organize a social basketball game on Good Friday. I remonstrated with them, reminding them that it was a day of prayer and penance and that a day of sport and frivolity shouldn't be on the cards. Their argument was that not everyone was a religious freak like me (!) and that it was a boring day. The latter argument seemed to be the one coming through strong on talk back radio when the debate about Good Friday football: that there's nothing to do and nothing to be entertained by.

Blaise Pascal, the great 17th Century Catholic philosopher, theologian (and mathematician and physicist) said that, "All of humanity's problems stem from man's inability to sit quietly in a room alone". The need for noise and busyness is such a curse on the modern man. The ability to be so easily bored is actually quite childish. It's fine to seek some relaxation, but even the idea of leisure has changed markedly over time. For the ancients this would include such things as reading and study, prayer and the playing of music. I imagine that would sound more like hard work and frustration to most people! What they are though are things that can be done without an external influence or without a bunch of people. They are done primarily by people who realise they are never alone, but always in the presence of God and the angels.

Acts of the Apostles 10:34,37-43 FIRST READING

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household: 'You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judaea; about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil. Now I, and those with me, can witness to everything he did throughout the countryside of Judaea and in Jerusalem itself: and also to the fact that they killed him by hanging him on a tree, yet three days afterwards God raised him to life and allowed him to be seen, not by the whole people but only by certain witnesses God had chosen beforehand. Now we are those witnesses - we have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead – and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead. It is to him that all the prophets bear this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name.'

It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him.'

So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.
