## "I Will Give You Shepherds..." Jeremiah 3:15

In this Sunday's Gospel Our Lord speaks of himself as the Good Shepherd, who is willing to lay down his life for his sheep...which is us! It's a beautiful image and one that is especially dear to me for a couple of reasons. Firstly, Good Shepherd in Gladstone Park is my home parish. It's where I was baptized and confirmed and it is where I celebrated my first mass of thanksgiving after ordination in 2015. A memory that is very dear to me. Secondly, it is a day on which we give thanks to God for priests that have nourished and guided us in our lives and when we especially pray for vocations to the priesthood and religious life. We are blessed to have been chosen to host a seminarian over this weekend to speak to the parish about their call to the priesthood. Vinh Do, a sixth year seminarian, will be here at St John's at all our masses to encourage all of us by his witness and sacrifice and hopefully inspire some young men in our community to follow in his footsteps!

I wrote last week in our bulletin of the need to adopt a missionary mindset in the living out of our faith, a mindset that is needed if we don't simply want to manage the decline of parish life in our Archdiocese. The heart of the church – its source of life and grace – is the Blessed Sacrament of the Eucharist. Without the mass there is no Sacrament, without the priesthood there is no mass. So we need priests for the life of the church, which is why the church asks us to pray for vocations and encourage them in our parishes and in our families.

To this end, the Archbishop has recently set up a vocations task force. I noted in the bulletin a few months back of the appointment of Fr Jerome Santamaria as new Vocations Director of the Archdiocese. Formerly he would have an assistant to help with putting together promotional material and conducting such things as school visits and retreats to help young people discern God's call in their life. But there's been a change of tact. There are now 8 priests across the diocese appointed to be vocations promoters (two for every region), and I am one of them. I was very happy to accept the role, though it does mean the need to invest time and energy especially for the task. The Archbishop is asking for one day a week to be dedicated to the job, which I'm not sure how I'm going to find but we'll give it a go! I ask for your prayers as I begin this role, but also your patience when other parish matters are not seen to as quickly as they might be. We priests are getting spread pretty thin at the moment, so all the more need to put some prayer and good works into helping young men say 'yes' to God to serve his church in its sacred ministry.

I am the good shepherd; I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I lay down my life for my sheep. And there are other sheep I have that are not of this fold, and these I have to lead as well. They too will listen to my voice, and there will be only one flock and one shepherd.

The Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me; I lay it down of my own free will, and as it is in my power to lay it down, so it is in my power to take it up again; and this is the command I have been given by my Father.'
