On Friday May 7th 2021 the Victorian Government announced that it is moving to a single QR Code Covid-19 check-in system. By Friday May 28th, the Melbourne Archdiocese is requesting that all parishes use this free Government Service. They are also asking that we strive to encourage and assist people in checking in at relevant parish activities (masses, weddings, baptisms etc.) Manual record keeping with pen and paper is only to be used if there is an internet outage or other technical issue arises.

To this end we are asking for volunteers to assist parishioners who do not have access to or struggle to use their phones to check in. Hopefully we will have sufficient volunteers to make up a roster so that the task doesn't fall to a few. Volunteers are needed for weekday masses, weekend masses, weddings, baptisms, funerals. FIRST READING

Acts 2:1-11

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome - Jews and proselytes alike - Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

SECOND READING

working in all of them. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose. Just as a human body, though it is made up of many parts, is a single unit because all these parts, though many, make one body, so it is with Christ. In the one Spirit we were all baptised, Jews as well as Greeks, slaves as well as citizens, and one Spirit was given to us all to drink.
