Miracle of O'Cebreiro

Last Sunday the Church celebrated the feast of Corpus Christi which honours the presence of the Body and Blood of Christ in the Holy Eucharist. Sadly we weren't able to gather together, though I certainly honoured the solemnity as best I could with a private mass in our beautiful church.

Belief in the presence of the Body, blood, soul and divinity of Christ in the Eucharist is something that many a Catholic can struggle with and have doubts over. Something that can help us believe in the Real Presence are knowing some of the Eucharistic miracles that have been given to us by God and approved by the Church to help strengthen our faith. Though rare (as is the nature of miracles) there have been many throughout the Church's history. One which I know and appreciate very much is the miracle of the mountain village of O'Cebreiro in Spain. Whilst walking the Camino to Santiago back in 2018, I was privileged to be able to offer mass at the very altar on which this miracle occurred, underneath the relic that has been preserved there for over 700 years. The story goes as such:

One icy winter in 1300 a Benedictine priest was celebrating Mass in a chapel beside the church of the convent of O'Cebreiro. It was a miserable day of heavy snow and freezing wind, so it was thought by the priest that no one would dare show up for Mass. He was wrong. A farmer from Barxamaior by the name of Juan Santín turned up. The priest saying Mass, who had lost his belief in the presence of Christ in the Eucharist and was generally weak in faith, despised in his heart the farmer's piety and sacrifice of good will. He began in this way to celebrate the Mass, but immediately after having professed the words of consecration, the Host changed to Flesh and the wine changed to Blood, and was expelled from the chalice and stained the corporal. At that very moment, it seemed that even the head of the wooden statue of the Madonna next to the altar was leaning in adoration. The people today call her the "Madonna of the Sacred Miracle". The Lord clearly had wanted to open the eyes of the priest who had doubted and to gift the farmer for his great devotion. Every year on the feast day of Corpus Christi the relics are taken in procession along with the statue of the Madonna throughout this beautiful town.

Miracles such as these do not form the basis for our belief in the presence of Christ in the Eucharist – we trust firstly in the words of Christ himself in the Gospels and the teaching of the Church – but they certainly strengthen it and they have led many back to the faith as a result. Thanks be to God!

For the time being, all Catholics in Melbourne continue to be dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass until further directed by the Archbishop. We continue to carry the happy obligation to keep Sunday holy, whether we can attend Mass or not, and can do so by any kind of prayer with members of our household and parish, reading holy scripture, and encouraging one another in our faith. Prayerfully watching an online Mass continues to be a great source of comfort on Sundays.

You will need to check in via QR code upon arrival. We are required to undertake electronic record keeping by using the Victorian Government QR Code Service through the Service Victoria app.

It will be even more important to come to Mass a little earlier to avoid delaying Mass. It would help greatly if all parishioners could please download the Service Victoria app before attending Mass by going to https://service.vic.gov.au/check-in/ and downloading the app either through the App Store (for Apple phones) or the Google Play Store (for Android phones). Please help a fellow parishioner who may not be able to use the QR code.

Using many parables like these, he spoke the word to them, so far as they were capable of understanding it. He would not speak to them except in parables, but he explained everything to his disciples when they were alone.
