Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I can't believe I'm actually writing this, but it was nice to see Collingwood win last week. For one, we can't be letting the Dees think they're that good a football side by getting two games clear on top of the ladder, but most of all it was nice to see Nathan Buckley end his time at the Pies with a win. I admired and respected Buckley as a player, and as a coach I always found his press conferences refreshing; never getting too carried away or buying into the media hype and very often including a bit of humour at his own expense.

Most seem to think that moving Buckley on was a good call. What we can say for sure at this stage is that now that Buckley is gone, the media and footy pundits will turn their attention some other poor fella trying to coach an AFL side and hound them out of their job. It's one of the less savoury elements of the modern game. Obviously hard on the individual and their family, what is perhaps more hard to accept is that the practice doesn't stand up to plain reason or even to popular wisdom when it comes to leading a successful organization or team.

It's overly simplistic to nominate one thing as the problem of something so complex as an AFL football club. It may provide some short term satisfaction, but lumping the success and failure of 40 players and as many staff on one person and position is plain silly. Clubs are waking up to this to some extent, with 'reviews' looking at entire departments, but this often leads to not just one but an entire array of people given the chocolates at the end of a season. Which highlights the other issue with the practice, being that changing culture and leading a successful organization typically takes years. If you have in mind to sack a leader in 18 months if they haven't 'succeeded', then you are merely setting yourself up for failure. There's a good chance that if Bomber Thompson, Damien Hardwick and Alastair Clarkson began their coaching careers now, they wouldn't have lasted long enough to see the great success they ultimately enjoyed.

This week I have my final session with Ron Huntley who has been guiding us as priests to lead a positive culture in parish life. He stressed in our last session the need for patience. Slow change is true change as the adage goes. It's a good reminder for all of us. When things aren't going the way we want in our family, professional or spiritual life, it's maybe because we've put unreal expectations on ourselves or those around us. Trusting that the Holy Spirit has led us faithfully on the path we now trod, blessings and success will most likely be seen if we humbly and patiently stay the course.
