#### SS JOHN FISHER AND THOMAS MORE

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This past week, on Tuesday June 22, we celebrated the feast day of Ss John Fisher and Thomas More. They are 15th Century martyrs of Reformation England, at the time of King Henry VIII. Perhaps it's just me, but I believe the cult and devotion towards them has grown in recent times. With More the patron saint of politicians and John Fisher being a bishop who stood up to civil authority, their story is resonating ever more strongly with us living at a time when the Church and state are increasingly at odds with one another. In honour of their feast, I include an excerpt here from one of my favourite Catholic writers, Monsignor Ronald Knox, on Fisher and More. It's from a book first printed in 1950 that is a collection of sermons titled *The Gospel in Slow Motion*. It goes as such:

"I want to seize on one splendid quality about them; their utter independence of mind. You see, the really curious thing about the English martyrs is that there are so few of them. Here you have a completely Catholic country which in a matter of twenty years or so goes Protestant, and nobody seems to mind very much. Why weren't all the other people martyrs too? And the answer to that question you can give in four words: MOST MEN ARE SHEEP. You can get them to accept anything, by bluffing them, by bullying them, by applying soft soap when it's needed. But there are a few of the important people in any generation who can't do that. They are not stupid enough to be hoodwinked by propaganda. They are too honest to be bribed by preferment. And they have just that touch of hardness about their minds which won't consent to sacrifice principle for the sake of general peace and calm. You can do nothing with such people, except martyr them. Such were St. John Fisher and St. Thomas More."

Knox goes on in this sermon to encourage his hearers to adopt a similar independent mindset to that of Fisher and More. To learn to distrust yourself the moment you find yourself saying things and thinking things merely because other people around you are saying them. A rather sobering line I'll leave you with from the end of Knox's sermon: *"If you become a yes-man you likely won't lose the faith, but you'll be a passenger; you'll be no use to the Church, when she wants you."* 

God preserve us from being useless passengers when it comes to our Catholic faith.


**GEMS 50+:** Due to COVID restrictions no gatherings planned until further notice.

#### SECOND READING 2 Corinthians 8:7. 9. 13-15

You always have the most of everything – of faith, of eloquence, of understanding, of keenness for any cause, and the biggest share of our affection – so we expect you to put the most into this work of mercy too. Remember how generous the Lord Jesus was: he was rich, but he became poor for your sake, to make you rich out of his poverty. This does not mean that to give relief to others you ought to make things difficult for yourselves: it is a question of balancing what happens to be your surplus now against their present need, and one day they may have something to spare that will supply your own need. That is how we strike a balance: as scripture says: The man who gathered much had none too much, the man who gathered little did not go short.

#### **GOSPEL ACCLAMATION**

Alleluia, alleluia! Our Saviour Jesus Christ has done away with death and brought us life through his gospel. Alleluia!

#### Gospel

When Jesus had crossed in the boat to the other side, a large crowd gathered round him and he stayed by the lakeside. Then one of the synagogue officials came up, Jairus by name, and seeing him, fell at his feet and pleaded with him earnestly, saying, 'My little daughter is desperately sick. Do come and lay your hands on her to make her better and save her life.' Jesus went with him and a large crowd followed him; they were pressing all round him.

Now there was a woman who had suffered from a haemorrhage for twelve years; after long and painful treatment under various doctors, she had spent all she had without being any the better for it, in fact, she was getting worse. She had heard about Jesus, and she came up behind him through the crowd and touched his cloak. 'If I can touch even his clothes,' she had told herself 'I will be well again.' And the source of the bleeding dried up instantly, and she felt in herself that she was cured of her complaint. Immediately aware that power had gone out from him, Jesus turned round in the crowd and said, 'Who touched my clothes?' His disciples said to him, 'You see how the crowd is pressing round you and yet you say, "Who touched me?"' But he continued to look all round to see who had done it. Then the woman came forward, frightened and trembling because she knew what had happened to her, and she fell at his feet and told him the whole truth. 'My daughter,' he said 'your faith has restored you to health; go in peace and be free from your complaint.'

While he was still speaking some people arrived from the house of the synagogue official to say, 'Your daughter is dead: why put the Master to any further trouble?' But Jesus had overheard this remark of theirs and he said to the official, 'Do not be afraid; only have faith.' And he allowed no one to go with him except Peter and James and John the brother of James. So they came to the official's house and Jesus noticed all the commotion, with people weeping and wailing unrestrainedly. He went in and said to them, 'Why all this commotion and crying? The child is not dead, but asleep.' But they laughed at him. So he turned them all out and, taking with him the child's father and mother and his own companions, he went into the place where the child lay. And taking the child by the hand he said to her, 'Talitha, kum!' which means, 'little girl, I tell you to get up.' The little girl got up at once and began to walk about, for she was twelve years old. At this they were overcome with astonishment, and he ordered them strictly not to let anyone know about it, and told them to give her something to eat.
