Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Catechesis

One of the chief roles of a priest is to teach the Catholic faith. Along with governing and sanctifying it is the way in which we help the bishop build up the Kingdom of God wherever we are sent. A labour of love at times, it is and should be for all of us a joy to help pass on the saving truth and goodness of God. Perhaps most enjoyable is teaching the faith to those wanting to be baptised and join the Catholic church. At the moment I'm guiding a young man from Alphington (mate of a mate) on this path of Catechesis, thanks be to God.

This has meant touching base again with the Catechism of the Catholic Church. The Catechism we have now was published in 1992. It was commissioned by Pope Saint John Paul II, with much of the work being done by then Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger, who of course went on to be Pope Benedict XVI. It is a great work, and far from being dry or turgid as might be imagined, it makes for great spiritual reading. The opening prologue, title is brilliant in reminding us of God's plan for us and how He carried it out.

God, infinitely perfect and blessed in himself, in a plan of sheer goodness freely created man to make him share in his own blessed life. God calls man to seek him, to know him, to love him with all his strength. He calls humanity together, scattered and divided by sin, into the unity of his family, the Church. To accomplish this, God sent his Son as Redeemer and Saviour. In his Son and through him, he invites men to become, in the Holy Spirit, his adopted children and thus heirs of his blessed life.

So that this call should resound throughout the world, Christ sent forth the apostles he had chosen, commissioning them to proclaim the gospel: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, to the close of the age." (Mt 28:19-20)

Those who with God's help have welcomed Christ's call are urged on by love of Christ to proclaim the Good News everywhere in the world. This treasure, received from the apostles, has been faithfully guarded by their successors. All Christ's faithful are called to hand it on from generation to generation, by professing the faith, by living it in fraternal sharing, and by celebrating it in liturgy and prayer. (Acts 2:42)

As one of my former religious teachers used to say: "Don't keep the faith – spread it!"

NAIDOC Week (July 4th - July 11th) celebrates the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

First Nations Catholics are the youngest and fastest growing demographic in the Australian Catholic Church. Data on the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander population for some years and prior to 1971 is not recorded due to the poor quality of data collected.

133,528 The number of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholics

5.8% The percentage of Catholic population aged under 5

10.2% The percentage of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island Catholics aged under 5

16 The number of Dioceses which have over onefifth of their Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander population who identify as Catholic.
