Vocations Awareness Week

Dear brothers and sisters,

National Vocations Awareness Week is celebrated in the first week of August each year. I typically have little time for all the different national days of this and weeks for that: we have a church calendar with seasons and saints that do a fine job of emphasising those things necessary to have us live a holy and happy life. That said, an opportunity and excuse to discuss and promote vocations is never a bad thing!

It's certainly a chance to encourage young men and women to consider the priesthood and religious life, but it's also a good chance to talk about some of life's most fundamental questions. What does a fulfilling life look like? What kind of life looks meaningful and purposeful? How do I find meaning and direction? How do I even start searching?

The vocations team at the Archdiocese have come up with a theme and a poster to match which is up at the back of the church. It's a bit corny, but it does possess a depth worthy of reflection. What does my life look like? Is it aimless, herd like and simply out to consume things and feed off others? Then you're a zombie. Or is it purposeful through obedience to truth, joyful because grounded in love, abundantly generous because free from selfishness? That's more like one who follows Christ. The life of a disciple.

God calls each person into existence and creates each of us in God's image. God then invites each person to grow in this likeness through participation in the life of Christ and his Church. But God does not force us. We really are invited. The truth of freedom and the freedom of truth are realised in my acceptance of God's will for my life, an acceptance which will make our life a pattern of the life of Jesus.

However, each one of us must live out this vocation. And so the call to holiness becomes an increasingly particular call in my life; and it becomes increasingly personal through my response to that call. You will grow as a person to the degree that you respond to God's will.

A life that is grounded in God will grow and will bear good fruit. It's in this that you realise that your vocation is not just a gift for you: it becomes something that nourishes and gives strength to others. Discipleship then truly does fulfill that which sums up all the commands of God: loving God and loving thy neighbour.

Exodus 16:2-4. 12-15

The whole community of the sons of Israel began to complain against Moses and Aaron in the wilderness and said to them, 'Why did we not die at the Lord's hand in the land of Egypt, when we were able to sit down to pans of meat and could eat bread to our hearts content! As it is, you have brought us to this wilderness to starve this whole company to death!' Then the Lord said to Moses, 'Now I will rain down bread for you from the heavens. Each day the people are to go out and gather the day's portion; I propose to test them this way to see whether they will follow my law or not.'

'I have heard the complaints of the sons of Israel. Say this to them, "Between the two evenings you shall eat meat, and in the morning you shall have bread to your hearts content. Then you will learn that I, the Lord, am your God."' And so it came about: quails flew up in the evening, and they covered the camp; in the morning there was a coating of dew all round the camp. When the coating of dew lifted, there on the surface of the desert was a thing delicate, powdery, as fine as hoarfrost on the ground. When they saw this, the sons of Israel said to one another, 'What is that?' not knowing what it was. 'That' said Moses to them 'is the bread the Lord gives you to eat.'

GOSPEL John 6:24-35

'I tell you most solemnly, you are not looking for me because you have seen the signs but because you had all the bread you wanted to eat. Jesus answered: 'I tell you most solemnly, it was not Moses who gave you bread from heaven, it is my Father who gives you the bread from heaven, the true bread; for the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world.' 'Sir,' they said 'give us that bread always.' Jesus answered: 'I am the bread of life. He who comes to me will never be hungry; he who believes in me will never thirst.'
