PARISH PRAYER

Heavenly Father, we the parishioners of St John's are grateful for all we have received from the men, women and children of our past. Help us to cherish and maintain our parish heritage. Most of all, enable us to be people who welcome the stranger, the needy, the sick and the lonely. Like St John, our patron saint, may we be people who love others, as your Son Jesus, asked us to do. We make this prayer, through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Dear brothers and sisters,

It is with some relief that I'm able to tell you that I'll be away on retreat next week. I'll be heading up to Castlemaine on Monday and returning Friday afternoon. Though I want to make a retreat and am very much looking forward to it, a priest actually has a duty to take a few days away every year to pray and recollect. Canon 276 of the Code of Canon Law outlines the special obligation that priests have to seek holiness in their lives, with the taking of an annual retreat being one of the ways that aim is realised. Given the goings and comings of last year, the retreat I had planned was cancelled so it's been over two years since I last made one. Far too long!

Included in this Canon are a number of other things that a priest is exhorted to fulfil and uphold to live a life worthy of his state. Namely, to work untiringly in leading and nourishing the people of God in his pastoral efforts, to do his best to offer the Holy Sacrifice of the mass every day, to engage in mental prayer regularly, to approach the sacrament of Confession often and finally, to honour the Virgin Mother of God with particular veneration.

These are all beautiful ways the church has set out to ensure her priests are conforming themselves closely to Christ and not straying too far from their vocation. But as they say, what is good for the goose is good for the gander. I would argue that each and every baptised Catholic would do very well to reflect these ideals as best they can. One thing the Vatican II Council tried to emphasize in its teachings is that holiness is something that each and every person is called to, and is not just the reserve of priests and religious. It may look a bit different in action, but the end goal is the same: to be a saint.

Therefore, I would encourage every layman to look at these obligations of priests and try to reflect and live out at least some of them in their own lives. For each person - but especially mothers and fathers - to work untiringly in leading and nourishing one another and their children in the faith; to attend the sacrifice of the mass not only when they are obliged each Sunday, but perhaps again during the week if they are able. Setting aside some quiet time for prayer each day and making the sacrament of confession a regular part of one's spiritual life are sure ways to stay close to Our Lord. And finally, venerating our Blessed Mother is something no Catholic should see as an option but something they ought to really foster as a sure way to grow closer to Jesus her Son. The past two years has been challenging in almost every way: perhaps a retreat or even a day of recollection is something you might consider in the coming months to reset and recalibrate your soul toward God.

As I strive to do just that in the coming week, you can all be assured of my prayers. In Christ,
