Dear brothers and sisters,

It was a welcome surprise to hear late Wednesday morning the announcement restrictions on gatherings in places of worship were to be easing as of that night. It was only a couple of days earlier that a priest friend and I were lamenting the fact that there didn't seem to be any road map suggesting when we could gather in churches without having to segregate and do head counts. It was a great relief. This sentiment was conveyed by our Archbishop who wrote to parishes on Thursday morning;

"We welcome this new provision for all people of faith to once again gather together for worship.

Just as on previous occasions, parity remains important, and we look forward to the time when all people can join together in various locations, and for the many activities that unite us fully as communities.

For Christians, as we approach this great season of hope and light that is Christmas, I encourage you to be places of invitation and welcome as we prepare to joyously celebrate the birth of our Saviour."

I know there remains some lockouts and restrictions for certain members of our community in certain places, but I do hope that Christian homes are not included among them. I'm hearing more and more stories of people who are being uninvited to Christmas break ups and celebrations and even family members facing the prospect of spending Christmas alone because of their medical decision. No room at the inn you might say. Welcoming the three kings and their gifts but locking out the 'dirty' shepherds. Blimey.

People are of course free to invite or not invite whoever they want into their homes. The idea though that some out there will now be doing their Christmas shopping at the likes of JB-Hi Fi and Kmart amongst throngs of thousands with an unknown vaccination status, and yet have already decided not to have Uncle Jack at the dinner table next Saturday is pretty sad.

To those of you that are being shunned in any way next week, you're in good company. It was locked out in the cold and dark that salvation came into this world. May the peace and joy of Christmas be felt especially by you this year in the depths of your hearts, where it really matters.

SECOND READING

Hebrews 10:5-10

This is what Christ said, on coming into the world: You who wanted no sacrifice or oblation, prepared a body for me. You took no pleasure in holocausts or sacrifices for sin; then I said, just as I was commanded in the scroll of the book, 'God, here I am! I am coming to obey your will.'

Notice that he says first: You did not want what the Law lays down as the things to be offered, that is: the sacrifices, the oblations, the holocausts and the sacrifices for sin, and you took no pleasure in them; and then he says: Here I am! I am coming to obey your will. He is abolishing the first sort to replace it with the second. And this will was for us to be made holy by the offering of his body made once and for all by Jesus Christ.
