Message from Our Blessed Mother

Dear brothers and sisters,

On Friday the church celebrated the feast of Our Lady of Fatima. I say feast, but in the calendar it is listed as an optional memorial – a celebration that you are free to observe or not in the mass and prayers for that day. I hope that it didn't simply get passed over by priests and others, as I think the messages that Our Lady gave at Fatima to the three shepherd children over 100 years ago is a message we need to hear and heed in our own day.

Some of you would be familiar with the story. It's a beautiful one, not simply in the messages themselves (they are actually quite harrowing), but in the way the children receive and respond to the apparitions they had of Our Blessed Mother. The story begins in the village of Fatima, Portugal, on May 13, 1917. The Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God, appeared to three peasant children: Francisco, Jacinta, and Lucia; ages 10, 9 and 7. These youngsters were tending their family's sheep when they witnessed "a Lady all in white, more brilliant than the sun… indescribably beautiful". From May through October 1917, the Lady appeared and spoke to the children on the 13th day of each month. When the children tried to tell others of these apparitions, they were mocked

and derided for what most thought were silly stories. The children were steadfast though in their insistence that the events were true. The mayor of the town, a Freemason named Artur Santos, went so far as to arrest the three children and interrogate them, threatening them with violence if they did not admit to it all being lies. The children were unmoved and insisted on the truth of what they heard and saw.

Our Lady's final appearance on October 13, 1917 included the great miracle of the sun: an event witnessed to by 70,000 people who had turned out to see if these children and these apparitions were to be believed. They most certainly were!

In these messages, Our Blessed Mother promised that God would grant peace to the entire world if we would pray, make reparation through penance and to strive with everything we've got to not fall into temptation and offend God by our sins. The prayer she implored souls to pray each day is that of the Holy Rosary and I honestly don't know anyone who hasn't taken up that challenge and not had their life transformed.

Our Lady of Fatima, pray for us! Bless,
