Dear Friends,

Who does not want to be acknowledged and honoured by others? In this Sunday's Gospel, again Jesus finds himself in the home of a Pharisee who had invited him to dinner. He observes how those invited were choosing the first places. It is a very common happening in life and not only at table: people are forever looking for the first place in the attention and consideration of others. Everyone, beginning with ourselves, has had this experience. But note well the words of Jesus who exhorts us to abstain from seeking the first place; it is not simply an exhortation to have good manners; it is a rule of life. And Jesus clarifies that it is the Lord who gives to each one dignity and honour; it is not we ourselves who give it to them.

Jesus' story tells us how we are to live, with humility, not putting ourselves first, and not making sure that we are in the places of honour and are acknowledged in public for what we do or who we are. We are to be among the least, to serve, eat with and dwell among those at the bottom. And we are to invite and make friends with those no one remembers to invite to the feast of the Lord and to a life of abundance and justice. We should be pleased to do as much as we can for those who cannot repay us. That is the way we are with God.

But what you have come to is Mount Zion and the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem where the millions of angels have gathered for the festival, with the whole Church in which everyone is a 'firstborn son' and a citizen of heaven. You have come to God himself, the supreme Judge, and been placed with spirits of the saints who have been made perfect; and to Jesus, the mediator who brings a new covenant.

**GOSPEL** Luke 14:1. 7-14

On a sabbath day Jesus had gone for a meal to the house of one of the leading Pharisees; and they watched him closely. He then told the guests a parable, because he had noticed how they picked the places of honour. He said this, 'When someone invites you to a wedding feast, do not take your seat in the place of honour. A more distinguished person than you may have been invited, and the person who invited you both may come and say, "Give up your place to this man." And then, to your embarrassment, you would have to go and take the lowest place. No; when you are a guest, make your way to the lowest place and sit there, so that, when your host comes, he may say, "My friend, move up higher." In that way, everyone with you at the table will see you honoured. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the man who humbles himself will be exalted.'

Then he said to his host, 'When you give a lunch or a dinner, do not ask your friends, brothers, relations or rich neighbours, for fear they repay your courtesy by inviting you in return. No; when you have a party, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; that they cannot pay you back means that you are fortunate, because repayment will be made to you when the virtuous rise again.'
