"THE PRAYER OF THE HUMBLE WILL PENETRATE THE HEAVENS"

Often I receive requests from people: "Father, please pray for me, for my children, or for my dad, mum, grandparents, relatives, friends, etc..." I suppose that you all receive the same requests from others. Often, I respond, "Definitely" or "Sure, I will keep you in my prayers." I sometimes reply, "Could I request you to pray for me too?" I find it really touching when we express our faith together and pray for one another.

Reflecting on my priestly ministry, especially when visiting people at home or in hospital I find it even more touching with this same request when in a conversation with a patient or those who are at the end of life. We know that what they need above all in this very moment of life is the mercy and love of God. Our prayers help them to rely on the healing power and love of God alone to find more strength to fight against sufferings and evils. In conversation and sharing we ask to pray for each other so that we may be united with the Lord in every moment of our lives. I carry with me all these requests in my daily prayers and especially in the Eucharist.

In last Sunday's readings at Mass, the word of God reminded us of the persistence in prayer that, we need to pray continually and never lose heart. We need to be constant and strong in prayer because if we become weary as did Moses, there are others holding us up spiritually. If a spiritual surcharge is needed the word of God enriches our prayer. If we become frustrated, we need to know, as Jesus says, that the Father hears every prayer expressed in faith and responds sometimes in strength and sometimes deep within through the seeds of grace. Whatever else we may exclude in our life, we should never, never give up on prayer.

Other than perseverance and faith, the Gospel of this Sunday's Mass encourages us that in prayer humility is necessary. "For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the man who humbles himself will be exalted."

We pray that the Lord gives us the humility not to hide our weakness, the wisdom to learn from our mistakes, and in facing life's difficulties let us know that his grace will be sufficient for us.

prayer to himself, "I thank you, God, that I am not grasping, unjust, adulterous like the rest of mankind, and particularly that I am not like this tax collector here. I fast twice a week; I pay tithes on all I get." The tax collector stood some distance away, not daring even to raise his eyes to heaven; but he beat his breast and said, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner." This man, I tell you, went home again at rights with God; the other did not. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the man who humbles himself will be exalted.'


