Dear parishioners,

This weekend is the first time that I am writing to share a few words with you. I want to share with you a little bit about my motto. It is a phrase taken by the candidates for Holy Orders by which they intend to live their lives after Ordination. What a great tradition that we have!

After much reflection and looking deep inside my heart for what I desired, I have chosen the following motto for my Ordination, a phrase from Saint Mark's gospel (6:34): "He had compassion for them."

This describes the person of our Lord Jesus according to saint Mark, that Jesus seeing the crowd who follow him to listen to him, "had compassion for them" (Mk 6:34).

Depending on which particular translation you use, the word "compassion" means "to suffer with" or in Greek – splagnizomai- so rich and beautiful, means a "gut-wrenching, emotional response that is so strong that we are physically moved to action." It is a dynamic word that attracts me as a person who is called into the service of others.

Firstly, I have been shown, felt and seen the compassion of the Lord Jesus in my own life. Because of his love for me, he came into the world to save me. He does not look at my lowly and earthly status, but looks at me as a lovable son of God, and shares with me his ministry of healing and saving others for the glory of God.

Secondly, upon receiving such graces in my life and no less, the grace of Ordination, Jesus strengthens me in my conviction of love and serve others with all my talents and strength. I have to carry out his great commandment which is for the Church, her ministers and for all the faithful, "just as I have loved you, so you also should love one another" (Jn 13:34).

Ordination is not an end, but a new beginning, a new chapter in my life. I pray that God will always remind me of this grace that I will receive at my Ordination so that I can live according to the example of Our Lord. It is because "he had compassion for them."

May I ask you, friends, to pray with and for myself and my fellow ordinands, and in return we will always keep you in our hearts as we journey together on this pilgrimage.

This was not because we had no right to be, but in order to make ourselves an example for you to follow.

We gave you a rule when we were with you: not to let anyone have any food if he refused to do any work. Now we hear that there are some of you who are living in idleness, doing no work themselves but interfering with everyone else's. In the Lord Jesus Christ, we order and call on people of this kind to go on quietly working and earning the food that they eat.

Luke 21:5-19 When some were talking about the Temple, remarking how it was adorned with fine stonework and votive offerings, Jesus said, 'All these things you are staring at now - the time will come when not a single stone will be left on another: everything will be destroyed.' And they put to him this question: 'Master,' they said, 'when will this happen, then, and what sign will there be that this is about to take place?'

'Take care not to be deceived,' he said, 'because many will come using my name and saying, "I am he" and, "The time is near at hand." Refuse to join them. And when you hear of wars and revolutions, do not be frightened, for this is something that must happen but the end is not soon.' Then he said to them, 'Nation will fight against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be great earthquakes and plagues and famines here and there; there will be fearful sights and great signs from heaven.

'But before all this happens, men will seize you

and persecute you; they will hand you over to the synagogues and to imprisonment, and bring you before kings and governors because of my name – and that will be your opportunity to bear witness. Keep this carefully in mind: you are not to prepare your defence, because I myself shall give you an eloquence and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to resist or contradict. You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, relations and friends; and some of you will be put to death. You will be hated by all men on account of my name, but not a hair of your head will be lost. Your endurance will win you your lives.'

The gospel is not written as a biography but as a means of conveying a message about Jesus. To this end, the writer seeks to give comfort to his audience by having Jesus 'predict' all the things that have indeed come to pass in their community. The message to a struggling community is to 'keep going.'
