FAREWELL TO POPE EMERITUS BENEDICT XVI: 'HUMBLE WORKER IN THE VINEYARD OF THE LORD' Dear Friends,

On the last day of the year 2022, the world and particularly Catholics received a very sad news that 'Former Pope Benedict XVI died in Vatican monastery aged 95.' In the past week, world leaders, religious leaders, Catholics and people all around the world have reacted at the news, mourned and paid respects to former Pope Benedict XVI.



In his homily at the traditional celebration of Vespers and recitation of the *Te Deum* in St Peter's Basilica on New Year's Eve, Pope Francis remembered his predecessor, recalling his great kindness, witness of faith and prayer, he said, "And speaking of kindness, at this moment, my thought naturally goes to dear Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI who left us this morning. We are moved as we recall him as such a noble person, so kind. And we feel such gratitude in our hearts: gratitude to God for having given him to the Church and to the world; gratitude to him for all the good he accomplished, and above all, for his witness of faith and prayer, especially in these last years of his recollected life. Only God knows the value and the power of his intercession, of the sacrifices he offered for the good of the Church."

Cardinal Blase Cupich the Archbishop of Chicago described Pope Benedict XVI as a "brilliant mind" who "made witnessing to the Gospel's call to-live-in-humble-service-to-all his priority."

Responding to the death of Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, Archbishop Peter A Comensoli has written to the People of God in Melbourne: "On this last day of the year, it is with deep sadness that we hear the news of the death of His Holiness, Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI. We unite with all the People of God in praying for the eternal rest of his soul and entrust him to the tender loving mercy of the Father. May the Lord he trusted in now welcome him home." Let us together remember and pray for the late Holy Father. May he rest in gracious and gentle peace.

You have probably heard how I have been entrusted by God with the grace he meant for you, and that it was by a revelation that I was given the knowledge of the mystery. This mystery that has now been

GOSPEL

Matthew 2:1-12

After Jesus had been born at Bethlehem in Judaea during the reign of King Herod, some wise men came to Jerusalem from the east. 'Where is the infant king of the Jews?' they asked. 'We saw his star as it rose and have come to do him homage.' When King Herod heard this he was perturbed, and so was the whole of Jerusalem. He called together all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, and enquired of them where the Christ was to be born. 'At Bethlehem in Judaea,' they told him 'for this is what the prophet wrote: 'And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, you are by no means least among the leaders of Judah, for out of you will come a leader who will shepherd my people Israel.'

Then Herod summoned the wise men to see him privately. He asked them the exact date on which the star had appeared, and sent them on to Bethlehem. 'Go and find out all about the child,' he said 'and when you have found him, let me know, so that I too may go and do him homage.' Having listened to what the king had to say, they set out. And there in front of them was the star they had seen rising; it went forward, and halted over the place where the child was. The sight of the star filled them with delight, and going into the house they saw the child with his mother Mary, and falling to their knees they did him homage. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts of gold and frankincense and myrrh. But they were warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, and returned to their own country by a different way.
