GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY-THE WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS

Dear Friends.

On this Good Shepherd Sunday, I would like to share some thoughts of my own journey of vocation. I was born in Vinh diocese in the north of Vietnam, into a family with 9 children. Before my entry to the seminary, I was a mathematics teacher in a secondary school in Vietnam.

But my vocation to the priesthood started at a very early age. When I was a child, my parents used to take me to daily Mass, teach me how to pray and tell me lots of stories about some priests they knew. My Dad said he wanted so much to be a priest himself, but couldn't because of the political situation at the time in Vietnam.

Perhaps my sense of vocation began from then on. I remember I used to imitate my parish priest at home, his words and actions at Mass-acting out Mass at home.

When I was 16, I went to live with my parish priest so that he could support me in study and the spiritual life.

Then, although, I worked as a teacher for 5 years I came to realize God was calling me to a life of service in the priesthood.

So, at the end of 2005, I decided to apply to study to be a priest for the Archdiocese of Melbourne. I began my seminary programme in 2007 at our seminary in Carlton, Corpus Christi College and I was ordained a priest on 28 June 2014. I have been a priest for nearly 9 years now and have served at five different parish communities including the parishes of Brunswick, Sunshine, Doncaster, Yea and Alexandra before coming to serve our parish here at Heidelberg. I always love my vocation and love being a Catholic priest. I find lots of joy and a privilege in my priestly ministry in my humble service of God and His people.

On this special day of prayer for vocations, could I ask you also please to pray for me, for our Assistant Priest Fr Kishore and for all the priests of the Church and all in the consecrated life that we may always be faithful to God, serve Him and God's people wholeheartedly.

Today, then, on this Good Shepherd Sunday, what does it mean for us? Hopefully, we can sense more deeply our vocation in life, appreciate it and feel affirmed in it and it encourages us all to consider the call of the Good Shepherd-the call to draw close to Him in the living of a particular vocation.

FIRST READING Acts of the Apostles 2:14, 36-41

Hearing this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and the apostles, 'What must we do, brothers?' 'You must repent.' The promise that was made is for you and your children, and for all those who are far away, for all those whom the Lord our God will call to himself.' SECOND READING

1 Peter 2,20-25

The merit, in the sight of God, is in bearing punishment patiently when you are punished after doing your duty.

This, in fact, is what you were called to do, because Christ suffered for you and left an example for you to follow the way he took. He had not done anything wrong, and there had been no perjury in his mouth. He was insulted and did not retaliate with insults; when he was tortured he made no threats but he put his trust in the righteous judge. He was bearing our faults in his own body on the cross, so that we might die to our faults and live for holiness; through his wounds you have been healed. You had gone astray like sheep but now you have come back to the shepherd and guardian of your souls.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

Alleluia, alleluia! I am the good shepherd, says the Lord; I know my sheep, and mine know me. Alleluia!

Jesus said: 'I tell you most solemnly, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold through the gate, but gets in some other way is a thief and a brigand. The one who enters through the gate is the shepherd of the flock; the gatekeeper lets him in, the sheep hear his voice, one by one he calls his own sheep and leads them out. When he has brought out his flock, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow because they know his voice. Jesus told them this parable but they failed to understand what he meant by telling it to them.

So Jesus spoke to them again: 'I tell you most solemnly, I am the gate of the sheepfold. All others who have come are thieves and brigands; but the sheep took no notice of them.

I am the gate. Anyone who enters through me will be safe: he will go freely in and out and be sure of finding pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I have come so that they may have life and have it to the full.'
