RENOVATIONS UPDATE

As our parish prayer above says, "Help us to cherish and maintain our parish heritage". It is exciting that we now will have new safer steps at the back entry to our beautiful church. The old steps served us well for 170 years, yes, however they were not ideal and quite dangerous as there was no landing for our porch. The new steps give us that safe landing into and out of the porch.

The changes inside the porch are happening over the next week or two and will all be in place prior to Easter. The aim is to ensure a safe well lit entry and a welcoming uncluttered porch for the future.

We listened to your feedback in the survey and hope that you find the works undertaken improve the welcome, inform people of our history, and give better access ,egress and lighting in the porch.

In the coming weeks a new confessional will be built in the back corner of the church and this will require the removal of two pews. The new confessional will replace one that was there originally and will meet standard requirements. The choir loft stairs will also be made safer, sanded and revarnished as well as have new safety treads on them.

The side chapel renovation will commence after Easter. We are moving forward and recognising our wonderful heritage as we do this.
