Dear Parishioners, Friends and Visitors

The Church

Two weeks ago I shared some reflections on the Church as the body of all who believe in Christ; the Body of Christ with Christ at its head, and the People of God.

The Church is a divine and a human institution. Every human society or group of people require some type of organisational structure in order to be able to function. The Church as a human institution is organised into a large number of groupings which we call Diocese. Within each diocese a bishop is appointed as head, shepherd and pastor. Among the bishops, the Bishop of Rome, the Pope, is the head. The Pope, the descendant of Peter the apostle, is the Vicar of Christ.

Very often, when we speak of Church we tend to forget that in the first instance it is the Body of Christ, the body of all the baptised who believe in Christ. Instead we find it easier to think of the Church as the organisational structure, the pope, the bishops and the priests.

Another 'mistake' that we often fall into is to forget that our leaders are human beings just like each one of us. Often, out of respect, we tend to place our leaders onto a

pedestal. This is not a healthy attitude both for our leaders and for ourselves as body. When we place our leaders on too high a pedestal and surround them with special dress and titles, we tend to find it difficult to talk to them and share with them what we really feel. Recently this relationship has often been referred to as 'clericalism.'

When we remind ourselves that our leaders are human, then we can relate to them as brothers and sisters, we realise that they too can sin, and we can also find it within ourselves to forgive them. We also need to remind ourselves that they need our prayers.

FIRST READING

Jeremiah 31:31-34

See, the days are coming – it is the Lord who speaks when I will make a new covenant with the House of Israel and the House of Judah, but not a covenant like the one I made with their ancestors on the day I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt. They broke that covenant of mine, so I had to show them who was master. It is the Lord who speaks. No, this is the covenant I will make with the House of Israel when those days arrive - it is the Lord who speaks. Deep within them I will plant my Law, writing it on their hearts. Then I will be their God and they shall be my people. There will be no further need for neighbour to try to teach neighbour, or brother to say to brother, 'Learn to know the Lord!' No, they will all know me, the least no less than the greatest - it is the Lord who speaks - since I will forgive their iniquity and never call their sin to mind.

During his life on earth, Christ offered up prayer and entreaty, aloud and in silent tears, to the one who had the power to save him out of death, and he submitted so humbly that his prayer was heard. Although he was Son, he learnt to obey through suffering; but having been made perfect, he became for all who obey him the source of eternal salvation.

GOSPEL

John 12:20-33

Among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. These approached Philip, who came from Bethsaida in Galilee, and put this request to him, 'Sir, we should like to see Jesus.' Philip went

to tell Andrew, and Andrew and Philip together went to tell Jesus. Jesus replied to them:

'Now the hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. I tell you most solemnly, unless a wheat grain falls on the ground and dies, it remains only a single grain; but if it dies, it yields a rich harvest. Anyone who loves his life loses it; anyone who hates his life in this world will keep it for the eternal life. If a man serves me, he must follow me, wherever I am, my servant will be there too. If anyone serves me, my Father will honour him. Now my soul is troubled. What shall I say: Father, save me from this hour? But it was for this very reason that I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name!' A voice came from heaven, 'I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.' People standing by, who heard this, said it was a clap of thunder; others said, 'It was an angel speaking to him.' Jesus answered, 'It was not for my sake that this voice came, but for yours. 'Now sentence is being passed on this world; now the prince of this world is to be overthrown. And when I am lifted up from the earth, I shall draw all men to myself.' By these words he indicated the kind of death he would die.

CONFRONTING SIN TO FIND LIFE

Jesus' mysterious statement at the beginning of today's Gospel that the Son of Man must be "lifted up" alludes to an episode during the Exodus wandering of Israel (Num 21:4-9). Finding themselves in the wilderness without food or water, the Israelites grumble against the Lord and against Moses. As a result they are punished with a plague of poisonous snakes.

But God who sent the punishment has also provided a remedy: the erection of a bronze figure of the snake in question. Looking upon this figure acts for the Israelites as a life-giving antidote to the poison.

The Gospel finds here a pointer to the coming "lifting up" of the Son of Man upon the cross. As the Israelites found salvation and life by directly confronting what was afflicting them, so those who "look upon" the Crucified One with faith, seeing him as the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world (1:29), will find eternal life.

The following sentence (3:16) wonderfully discloses the extremity of God's love. While desirous that we appreciate the evil and destructiveness of sin by confronting it in the cross, God's whole intent in regard to the world is not to condemn but to save and communicate life.

Judgment, then, is not so much something to be executed in the future. Judgment is something that believers already undergo when they expose their lives to the searching but saving light that Christ, as "true Light", brings into the world. It is to this kind of "judgment" that Lent invites us each year.
