## 28/29 Oct 2017 - 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Yr A

Dear parishioners, visitors and friends,

This week we start the month of November, a month during which we remember in a special way all those who have gone before us and an opportunity for us to reflect on the end of our own life. The month start off with two special feast days: All Saints and All Souls, two very distinct but closely related celebrations.

God created all women and men in his own image and likeness and we can only reach our fulfilment when we live his life in its fullness. As Christians we live this journey as members of the Church, sharing our faith with other believers and forming the Body of Christ, with Christ himself at the head. Here on earth we walk along this pilgrim journey and respond in faith to God's call as we come to know God and learn to see him with the eyes of faith.

Jesus tells his disciples to 'be holy as your Father in heaven is holy!' We achieve this holiness when we die in Christ and rise again with him in God. On the 1st day of November we celebrate all our sisters and brothers who have walked this way before us and have reached their perfection in God. Some of these are officially recognised by the Church and placed before us as role models; but many others, among them our own relatives and friends, are also counted among the saints as they have loved and believed in God.

Sinfulness is part of our weak human nature, and we can only reach God after of period of purification which we call purgatory. On the 2nd of November we remember and pray for those who have gone before us and are still in this state of purification; we pray that their sins are forgiven and they can join the fullness of life in God.

The Eucharist is the moment when we join in one great celebration together with our sisters and brothers who celebrate in God. It is a moment when we thank God for all the gifts he showered on these sisters and brothers who have gone before us.
