Openness to the Coming Rule Of God

Today's Gospel begins the readings from the Gospel of Mark, the Gospel proper to the current liturgical year Year (B). Mark's Gospel offers a message of liberation. Empowered by the Spirit (1:10), Jesus, the Son of God, comes to free human beings from all the captivities that hold them bound. From the start he is locked in a conflict with demonic forces that stunt human lives, alienating them from life-giving relationship with God and their own true humanity. Jesus, the "Stronger one", will baptize people with the power of the Spirit (1:7-8) "binding up" Satan (3:27) and end his rule. In its place, proclaim and inaugurate the "Rule" or "Kingdom of God.

Jesus proclaims the onset of the Kingdom in the opening words of today's Gospel: "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news". The "time" that has come is the time when Satan's rule is to be challenged and human lives reclaimed for God. The "repentance" that is called for is not simply repentance for sin but a change of heart or mind, an openness to a whole new vision of God and God's action in the world—something that will shake prevailing structures and thinking to their foundations.

Jesus goes on to call disciples to assist him in this mission. Former "fishers of fish" are to be transformed into "fishers of people", reclaiming human lives for the community of the Church, which is intended to be a kind of "beachhead" of the Kingdom in the world.

LIVING THE GOSPEL – THE GOOD NEWS IS HERE.

This week's gospel marks the beginning of Jesus' public ministry in the Gospel of Mark. The gospel writer has Jesus clearly announcing his message in plain, simple language: 'The kingdom of God is close at hand. Repent, and believe the Good News.' That message is as true for us today as it was when those words were first spoken. The kingdom is still close at hand if we would only recognise it in our midst rather than pinning our hopes on some future reward. The call to repent and believe the Good News is as relevant for us as it was for the first believers.

FIRST READING

Jonah 3:1-5, 10

The word of the Lord was addressed to Jonah: 'Up!' he said 'Go to Nineveh, the great city, and preach to them as I told you to.' Jonah set out and went to Nineveh in obedience to the word of the Lord. Now Nineveh was a city great beyond compare: it took three days to cross it. Jonah went on into the city, making a day's journey. He preached in these words, 'Only forty days more and Nineveh is going to be destroyed.' And the people of Nineveh believed in God; they proclaimed a fast and put on sackcloth, from the greatest to the least.

God saw their efforts to renounce their evil behaviour. And God relented: he did not inflict on them the disaster which he had threatened.

1 Corinthians 7:29-31

Brothers, our time is growing short. Those who have wives should live as though they had none, and those who mourn should live as though they had nothing to mourn for; those who are enjoying life should live as though there were nothing to laugh about; those whose life is buying things should live as though they had nothing of their own; and those who have to deal with the world should not become engrossed in it. Mark 1:14-20

As he was walking along by the Sea of Galilee he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net in the lake - for they were fishermen. And Jesus said to them, 'Follow me and I will make you into fishers of men.' And at once they left their nets and followed him.

Going on a little further, he saw James son of Zebedee and his brother John; they too were in their boat, mending their nets. He called them at once and, leaving their father Zebedee in the boat with the men he employed, they went after him.
