TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME, YEAR B

"He was oppressed and he was afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth..." – Isaiah 53:7

Dear brothers and sisters,

I was rather shocked and a little saddened when I woke up on Wednesday morning to learn that Norm Macdonald, stand-up comedian and actor, had died at the age of 61. Though not to everyone's taste, his deadpan style and sarcasm were hilarious to me. He had an ability to take tragic elements in life and history and somehow make them funny. And he did so without really insulting anyone, which in today's world is pretty much impossible. Though he was never part of a formal church, Norm described himself as a Christian. It was nice to hear one US political commentator (who is a Catholic) say that he and Norm had been exchanging some lengthy messages in recent months, with almost all of them being on the topic of faith. I'm not sure if Norm was ever baptised but here's hoping.

The part that was surprising was hearing that he died from cancer; an acute leukemia that he was diagnosed with 9 years ago. No one knew this, with Norm keeping the fact even from some of his family members. I'm not suggesting anyone unfortunate enough to be in similar circumstance ought to do the same: the support of family and friends can be the thing that gets you through such tough times. And I've no doubt those close to him would be frustrated and even a little angry that they weren't able to offer their support to him. But to bear one's sufferings patiently and in silence is something that God would seem to uphold as exemplary. We were reminded of this on Thursday when we celebrated the memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows. Mary glorifies God and we in turn praise her for her faith and constancy, which is epitomised by her standing at the foot of the cross of her dying Son. As borne out by the scriptures, Mary offers no word nor act of remonstrance as her own heart is pierced with such great sorrow.

It's a great irony that one of the best Norm Macdonald lines was, when being told that some figure in history was in fact dead: "I didn't even know he was sick". Even from the grave Norm is able to deliver punchlines. Funny as that is, the fact that no one knew Norm was sick - that he carried his cross without wanting in any way to burden others - may be one of the things that helps him get to heaven.

Peacemakers, when they work for peace, sow the seeds which will bear fruit in holiness.

Where do these wars and battles between yourselves first start? Isn't it precisely in the desires fighting inside your own selves? You want something and you haven't got it; so you are prepared to kill. You have an ambition that you cannot satisfy; so you fight to get your way by force. Why you don't have what you want is because you don't pray for it; when you do pray and don't get it, it is because you have not prayed properly, you have prayed for something to indulge your own desires.

GOSPEL

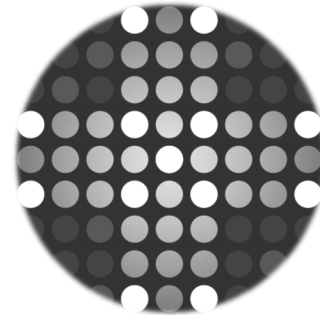
Mark 9:30-37

After leaving the mountain Jesus and his disciples made their way through Galilee; and he did not want anyone to know, because he was instructing his disciples; he was telling them, 'The Son of Man will be delivered into the hands of men; they will put him to death; and three days after he has been put to death he will rise again.' But they did not understand what he said and were afraid to ask him.

They came to Capernaum, and when he was in the house he asked them, 'What were you arguing about on the road?' They said nothing because they had been arguing which of them was the greatest. So he sat down, called the Twelve to him and said, 'If anyone wants to be first, he must make himself last of all and servant of all.' He then took a little child, set him in front of them, put his arms round him, and said to them, 'Anyone who welcomes one of these little children in my name, welcomes me; and anyone who welcomes me welcomes not me but the one who sent me.'
