# STAY AWAKE, PRAYING AT ALL TIMES

Today's Gospel, taken from Jesus' long instruction on the future (Luke 21:5-38), focuses on his second coming. It is full of the kind of apocalyptic descriptions and portents that have always excited the fundamentalist religious imagination. We need not dwell on these. The important thing to focus on is the basic intent of such instruction, which is to address the sense of dismay and the challenge to hope that calamities of various kinds present. While God may appear to be silent or absent, somehow all these things are held within the divine purpose, which will ultimately win through.

While the basic message, then, is one of comfort, the second part of the Gospel adopts a more admonitory tone. The time of waiting requires attentiveness and a sharp spiritual sense. Believers must be like people who expect visitors but are unsure when exactly they will arrive. Anything that dulls the spirit (debauchery and drunkenness) or causes it to be distracted (absorption in the cares of life) must be avoided, commitment to prayer intensified.

Advent is a time for examination in such areas. It is also a time for exploring our deepest longings and desires and allowing them to surface. They can ride up, so to speak, on the Scripture texts that the Church puts before us at this time.

God's only wish in our regard is to communicate to us the life and love for which we long. Each Advent should expand both our longing and our capacity to receive the gift of God.
