The Month of May-dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Dear Friends, May is traditionally dedicated in a special way to honouring and seeking the intercession

of Mary as the Mother of God and Mother of the Church. Many great popes, saints, and Christian leaders have exhorted us to pray the Rosary. It's

a powerful prayer, they say, one that can change your life, strengthen the family, bring peace to the world, convert entire nations, and win the salvation of souls.

As Pope St John Paul II explained, the repeated prayers in the rosary help us get more in touch with the deepest desires in our souls for God.

In his letter to all the faithful in 2020, Pope Francis encourages us to pray the Rosary, especially during the month of May, as he says it is a time, "When the People of God express with particular intensity their love and devotion for the Blessed Virgin Mary".

Pope Francis encourages everyone to, "Rediscover the beauty of praying the Rosary at home in the month of May", whether individually or as a group, "making the most both opportunities".

I remember that I was taught by my parents how to pray including how to say the Rosary. In the family, we usually prayed and recited the Rosary together in the morning. My parents often encouraged each of us to lead the Rosary for the family when we pray. In the evening, we joined the whole community in church for Mass and prayers, especially reciting the Rosary together. During this month, we often went to church at noon to recite the Rosary together as the whole community. In the evening, we gathered again in church to say prayers and brought flowers to put in the front of the shrine or chapel of Our Lady. We paid our respect to the Blessed Virgin Mary by singing and dancing or sometime in a solemn procession carrying the statue of Our Lady around the church and in the streets around the village. This is still a practice of the people in my home parish and in many places in Vietnam nowadays.

In our parish here at St John's Heidelberg, the Rosary is recited after every weekday Mass by our parishioners. It is a wonderful way to honour Our Mother the Blessed Virgin Mary, especially during this month of May so that we can learn from her to ponder the words of God to us, to imitate, and follow God's will for us in our daily living and ask her to intercede for us before God.

Pope Benedict XVI reflected in Deus Caritas Est (Dec. 2005), "Outstanding among the saints is Mary, Mother of the Lord and mirror of all holiness. Mary's greatness consists of the fact that she wants to magnify God, not herself. She is lowly: her only desire is to be the handmaid of the Lord."

Mary, more than anyone, can show us Jesus, lead us to Him and teach us to know and love Him, "so that we too can become capable of true love and be fountains of living water in the midst of a thirsting world."

Holy Mary, Mother of God. Pray for us.
