

We engage in activities such as practising mindfulness, developing new interests, cultivating healthy relationships, and pursuing personal goals. At St John's we teach our students about the place of faith and prayer in their lives. Living a prayerful life gives students opportunities to foster spiritual growth. Prayer provides the means of communication with God and seeking presence, guidance, and grace. Following the example of Jesus and serving others can be a powerful opportunity to grow spiritually. 
