Let your heart sing! Fr Mario

Dear St John's parish family,

These are the last days of being here with you in Heidelberg. There are so many things to talk about and share before I leave, the problem is where to start and how to put words to my emotions. A dear friend suggested that I simply 'let my heart sing and it will be great.' I have never been any good at singing, but I reckon this time I will manage!

As I shared on other occasions, seven years ago I had absolutely no idea where Heidelberg was. When asked I probably would have answered that it was a city in Germany! I arrived back in the country from Manila in September and Archbishop Hart asked me to come and support you until a permanent parish priest could be found for St John's. That is how the adventure started and three months turned into just short of seven magnificent years.

When I came to St John's I knew no one here, it was all new to me, parish, primary school, two regional colleges, a few hospitals, and the rest! I admit the beginning was a bit challenging, trying to put my head around this new environment. It only took a few days for strangers started knocking on the parish house door, and a few moments later left as friends. The list of friends did not take long to grow and I soon



found my new family here. I still laugh at some of the incidents that happened in those first few weeks until I got the hang of doing things the Heidelberg way. On the very first evening, as I was being shown around the church and locking up for the night, I went into the 'nuns' chapel' and, with the intention of locking, I turned the knob on the door. A voice behind me reprimanded: 'You have unlocked it now!' I remember this small incident every time I go to lock that door.

(Un)fortunately we all have different characters, and Fr Ted and I, apart from a twenty-five year difference in age, did things quite differently, and people had to get used to my quirky way of doing things. I thank God that Fr Gentle Ted hung around and supported my leadership. I truly appreciate his friendship and respect.

One thing I always enjoyed doing in BC years (before Corona), was to hi-5 children as I walked down the aisle. It is a very simple way of connecting with children and making them feel important. Soon enough some adults also started to raise their hand for a hi-5, one of these was Sylvia Cross! At her funeral her husband Jim told us that my hi-5s won Sylvia over as a friend!

Every Monday morning, at 8:30, I walked over to the school yard to welcome our beautiful students at the beginning of a school week. Yes, you guessed it, there were lots of hi-5s to go around with school children, their younger siblings and their parents. This was a great way to get to know children and their parents. I had many deep conversations with school parents both on Monday mornings, and on other occasions.

Monday was my 'school day.' After my morning Mass the first item on my agenda was my weekly catch-up with the principal, the religious education leader, and other members of staff. I enjoyed hearing about the good news coming from our parish school, it made me very proud of the good work that was happening all the time in our parish. At times I tried to visit some classrooms and chat with the students, teachers soon got used to my unannounced visits at any time of the day! At other times we had school Masses, level Masses or class Masses.

At times I was called upon to celebrate with OLMC and Marcellin College. At Marcellin I was part of a group of priests providing Mass every Thursday. Both colleges always welcomed me as a friend and I totally enjoyed working with principals, staff and students.

The hospitals were never too far and, although I will not miss my pager or my night calls, I thoroughly enjoyed my hospital visits and visits to our nursing homes. Once again I often had many deep conversations with patients, family members, members of staff and members of the spiritual care department. I made some good friends at the hospitals. Most of my calls were to the palliative ward in the Olivia Newton-John Centre. My visits were so regular that when I rang the ward, I had no need to introduce myself, I recognised their voices and they recognised mine! At the hospitals and the nursing homes I was assisted by many other priests and parishioners who worked hard to give a good service to the patients.

The next part of my ministry was meeting with people, preparing for the sacraments or asking for some advice. Journeying with parishioners, listening to their stories and sharing their experiences is a most beautiful part of my ministry. At times I was also invited to parishioners' homes for a home blessing, a prayer or a delicious meal. Meals are an ideal opportunity to get to know each other, to share experiences and to build friendships. It is always easier to relate to people after having shared a meal with them. On my first Saturday in the parish I told parishioners that I liked to be invited for a meal with families. In the front seat were two young boys together with their parents; they happened to be visiting their grandmother, a parishioner, for the weekend. No sooner had I gone back to the parish house, the phone rang, and I was asked to go over for a meal! Not a bad start at all!

My work was made easier with the help of a very efficient parish secretary, a top class master chef, the various members on the parish council and finance committee, the pastoral team and the many many other parish volunteers who stepped forward in one way or another to offer their ministry. Thank you all for your patience with me. Discussions always took their time until we could reach a consensus and tried to journey on together as a united body. The four parishioners who served as parish council chairpersons and the chair of the finance committee deserve a special mention. They often worked behind the scenes, but that is where work really happens! I was often carried, and always greatly supported, by these wonderful people who I



cannot help but call them dear friends!

The highlight of my week was always the weekend Masses, which I shared with Fr Ted. It was always a great joy to watch the community come together in the Father's house to celebrate as one big family. In our community we come together from different spheres of life and different ages; we had young children only a few days old and parishioners who had already celebrated their ninetieth birthday! All came together and all raised their voices as one. The younger children praised God in tongues while older parishioners used words we could understand!

Dear sisters and brothers, it is not easy to leave home! But, as we all know, there is always a time to say goodbye. I have avoided mentioning names, because there are too many to mention, but I will carry with me very many beautiful memories and friendships. I totally enjoyed every moment of my stay in your home.



The pager goes off at 3:20am. End of life care/last rites has been requested by the family of a patient dying in the Austin hospital. A nurse anxiously awaits a phone call to say that the priest can come in - when she hears Fr Mario's voice, she relaxes and goes to reassure the family that a priest is on his way. When Fr Mario arrives he shares a gentle joke and some kind, supportive words with the staff before greeting the family and patient. He is not just there to perform a rite. He is there to pastorally care for them all in their time of suffering and grief, embodying Jesus' love and compassion for them. Even though he is tired and sleep-deprived, he takes the time to listen to their stories, to get to know the patient who is nearing the end of life. When he finishes, he leaves behind a family who have experienced God's comfort and mercy, and grateful staff members who are reminded that spiritual and religious needs are so fundamental at times like this.

Fr Mario has been integral to the pastoral and spiritual care ministry of Austin Health over the past six years. His calm, pastoral presence has been valued by staff, patients and families alike and his sense of humour and capacity for teamwork has helped build very successful relationships within the Pastoral Care Department and on wards such as the palliative care ward. Many nursing staff have spoken of his care for them and the renewed respect



they have for the priesthood and the Catholic church because of their encounters with him. Fr Mario's capacity to work with the administrative complexities of hospital administration has made my role as manager so much easier and I have enjoyed his collegiality immensely. His commitment to Sunday masses at Austin and Repat and his engaging manner in leading liturgy have brought comfort and hope to those stuck in hospital.

Fr Mario, you will be dearly missed here at Austin and we thank you for all that you have offered us in your ministry – we have been blessed!




