Happy Christmas!

A few days ago, on Tuesday 8th December, feast of the Immaculate Conception of Mary, Pope Francis inaugurated the jubilee Holy Year of Mercy. A jubilee Holy Year is an invitation to engage once again in a deep relationship with God.

The pope wants to remind that God is full of mercy; he is forever ready to engage with us and welcome us back. The great image of the father in the parable of the prodigal son, waiting to welcome back his younger son after he had squandered all his inheritance, and the figure of the good shepherd who goes out of his way to look for just one sheep that is lost.

God's great mercy and love led him to create us in his own image and likeness and to provide the universe for us to inhabit. God wants us to encounter him so as to enjoy his great love. He does this by constantly revealing himself to us. Creation itself is an image of God: as we look and meditate upon the greatness of creation, we can see aspects of God. In the Old Testament God continued to reveal himself through his chosen people by sending them innumerable prophets and messengers.

God's revelation of himself reached its fullness when he sent his only Son, his Word, to be born among us as a human person. God first hid himself for us to discover him in creation, then he hid himself in the message of the prophets, finally he hid himself in the form of a small human child for us to discover him and engage with him.

Christmas is the moment when God's mercy shines out: Jesus Christ born in Bethlehem is the ultimate sign of God's great love and mercy for each one of us. God invites us to listen and participate in his mercy and love. How do I accept this invitation in my daily life as a Christian? How do I show God's mercy to those around me?

ST JOHN CATHOLIC TENNIS CLUB

In what has been a consolidation of local parish tennis clubs St John's has been the beneficiary, in that members of those clubs have been and are members of our parish tennis club.

In addition to 30 plus members enjoying social tennis at various times during the week including Friday mornings and Sundays, the club has in excess of 90 boys and girls competing in Friday night and Saturday morning competitions and 60 or more members representing the club in night tennis competitions.

The club caters for all levels from beginners to those competing at the top level in local district competitions.

We are extremely proud of our section 1 girls who for the second season running were premiers and of our young boys' and girls' teams.
