ORDINATION OF DEACONS AND PRIESTS

ST JOHN VIANNEY (1786—1859)

Feast day: August 4

The feast of Curé of Ars, model and patron of parish priests, is celebrated on the anniversary of his death. He was canonized in 1925 by Pope Pius XI, who also named him patron saint of all parish clergy in 1929.

Born near Lyons, France, in 1786, of a very devout family, John Vianney was five years old when the reign of terror in Paris was exiling or murdering the Catholic clergy and religious. He received his First Communion at a time when the troops of the French Revolution passed through the region and closed the parish church. His vocation was stimulated by contact with a holy priest and two years later he received his father's permission to study for the priesthood. He was not an outstanding student, but he was finally ordained in 1815 at the age of 29.

He was assigned to the parish at Ars, some distance from Lyons, and he remained there for 42 years because the people repeatedly opposed his transfer.

He himself tried several times to leave Ars in order to follow a contemplative life. He refused the appointment as a canon of the diocese and when he received the medal of the Legion of Honour in 1843, he sold it in order to give the money to the poor. He died of exhaustion at the age of 74, as he had predicted, peacefully and without fear.

ST MARY OF THE CROSS MACKILLOP

(1842—1909) Feast day: August 8

Mary was born into a large Australian family in Melbourne. By the age of eight, she was her mother's right hand in caring for the other children. From the time she learned of how her father had dropped out of the seminary, Mary longed to "live for God alone."

At sixteen, Mary left home for work. She met Father Julian Tennison Woods, who told her of the great needs of the children living in the rough rural regions of Australia. Six years later Mary left her family and with Father Woods co-founded an order to serve them: the Sisters of Saint Joseph of the Sacred Heart. The sisters maintained poverty, all the while exhibiting unprecedented independence in their travels to the children in the vast Australian Bush. Their new approach raised the ire of the established clergy, and at the age of twenty-nine Mary was excommunicated by a misinformed bishop. She accepted this in silence, and the ban was lifted six months later. Yet years of struggle with the Church authorities remained. Throughout, Mary calmly advocated for the work among the children.

Toward the end of her life, unable to write because of a stroke, Mary pecked out the following on her typewriter: "Whatever troubles may be before you, accept them cheerfully, remembering whom you are trying to follow. Do not be afraid. Love one another, and let charity guide you in all your life."
