### OUR LADY HELP OF CHRISTIANS

The feast day of the principal patroness of Australia falls this Friday 24 May 9.15am Mass. *The Feast Day of Our Lady Help of Christians has been celebrated in Australia since 1844. This title of Our Lady dates back to the early 1800's, to the time when Napoleon Bonaparte had kept Pope Pius VI and later Pope Pius VII under house arrest in Paris. The infant church in Australia had special reason for turning to Mary. No priests were sent to the colony in its early days and Mass was not allowed except for one brief year until 1820. It was largely the Rosary in those early days that kept the faith alive. The Australian Catholic community remained faithful to Mary, and Australia was first in the world to choose her under the title, 'Mary Help of Christians' as principal Patroness. Australia was also first to have a cathedral dedicated to Our Lady. St Mary's Cathedral Sydney was dedicated in her honour by the Irish pioneer priest, Fr John Therry who arrived in Sydney in 1820.*

# St Vincent de Paul Society

## *Our Mission ...*

The Society of St Vincent de Paul is a lay Catholic organisation that aspires to live the Gospel message by serving Christ in the poor with love, respect, justice, hope and joy, and by working to shape a more just and compassionate society.

## *Our Beginnings ...*

The Society of St Vincent de Paul began in Paris in 1833.

A group of Catholic university students, led by Blessed Frederic Ozanam, were involved in debates on religion. Against sceptical opponents, Frederic argued that Christianity had always fostered human progress. He demonstrated this with evidence from history.

They challenged him: *"But what is the Church doing now?"*

*What are **you** doing?*

*Show us your works, then we might believe!"*

Ozanam took up the challenge. His response? *"We must do what Jesus did ... Let us go to the poor."*

The Society was established under the patronage of St Vincent de Paul. In less than two years it had 100 members. Today the Society continues to serve people in need in over 140 countries.

The first Conference in Victoria was established at St Francis Church Melbourne in 1854.

St Vincent de Paul has been part of St Anthony's parish life since 1930.

## *Our Work ...*

The main work of the Society today is assisting people in times of distress. At the heart of all that the Society does is the sharing of ourselves, person to person, and the sharing of what we have – food, clothing, shelter, skills, advice, etc. Members of the Society assist in a number of programs and activities including home visits, emergency food, clothing & furniture, op shops, educational & recreational support, emergency recovery, kids' camps, kids' days out, soup vans. ***What would you like to be involved in?***

## *In Glen Huntly ...*

St Vincent de Paul East Brighton began providing assistance in our area in February 2018, responding to 5 requests for help. As people in need became aware of the work of St Vincent de Paul in Glen Huntly there are now more than 12 calls per month *and increasing*.

By May 2019, 105 visits have been made distributing \$15,000 worth of food, Vinnies cards for clothing and footwear, and furniture.

Callers typically include men and women living in rooming houses and flats. Single mothers fleeing abusive partners, grandparents looking after grandchildren, persons recently released from detention, persons with mental health issues, and persons suffering drug addiction.
