These inspections will be undertaken during May/June this year.

In order to be compliant, Clergy, employees and volunteers are required to sign the Code of Conduct on an annual basis.

This is a requirement from the Child Safety Department of the Victorian Government.


Divine Mercy Devotion

The background of the Devotion

The devotion to Jesus as The Divine Mercy is based on the revelations Saint Faustina Kowalska received in 1930s about God being merciful. The message of mercy is that God loves us — all of us —no matter how great our sins. He wants us to recognize that His mercy is greater than our sins, so that we will call upon Him with trust, receive His mercy, and let it flow through us to others. Thus, all will come to share His joy. It is a message we can call to mind simply by remembering ABC.

A — Ask for His Mercy. God wants us to approach Him in prayer constantly, repenting of our sins and asking Him to pour His mercy out upon us and upon the whole world.

B — Be merciful. God wants us to receive His mercy and let it flow through us to others. He wants us to extend love and forgiveness to others just as He does to us.



C — Completely trust in Jesus. God wants us to know that the graces of His mercy are dependent upon our trust. The more we trust in Jesus, the more we will receive.

Living the Message of Mercy

The devotional practices revealed through Saint Faustina were given to us as "vessels of mercy" through which God's love can be poured out upon the world, but they are not sufficient unto themselves. It's not enough for us to hang The Divine Mercy image in our homes, pray the Chaplet every day at three o'clock, and receive Holy Communion on the first Sunday after Easter. We also have to show mercy to our neighbours. Putting mercy into action is not an option of the Divine Mercy Devotion; it's a requirement!

The Image of the Divine Mercy

On February 22nd, 1931 Jesus appeared to her with rays radiating from His heart and said, "Paint an image according to the pattern you see, with the signature: Jesus I trust in You. I desire that this image be venerated, first in your chapel, and throughout the world." (*Diary*47)

I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish. I also promise victory over its enemies already here on earth, especially at the hour of death. I myself will defend it as My own glory. (*Diary*48). I am offering people a vessel with which they are to keep coming for graces to the fountain of mercy. That vessel is this image with the signature" :Jesus, I trust in You." (*Diary*327)

The two rays denote Blood and Water. the pale ray stands for the Water which makes souls righteous. The red ray stands for the Blood which is the life of souls. These two rays issued forth from the very depths of My tender mercy when My agonized heart was opened by a lance on the Cross. These rays shield souls from the wrath of My Father. Happy is the one who dwell in their shelter, for the just hand of God shall not lay hold of him. (*Diary*299). Not in the beauty of the colour, nor of the brush, lies the greatness of this image, but in My grace. (*Diary*313)

How to Pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet

You can use regular Rosary beads for this prayer.

Step 1: Introductory Prayer

Make the Sign of the Cross, then say the following prayer:

Prayer at the hour of Mercy (3 O'clock Prayer)

"You expired, Jesus, but the source of life gushed forth for souls, and the ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole world and empty Yourself out upon us.

(Repeat 3 times) O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fount of mercy for us, I trust in You!"

Step 2: First Three Prayers

On the first three beads next to the crucifix pray, 1 Our Father, 1 Hail Mary and The Apostles Creed.

Step 3: Eternal Father Prayer

Then on the first Our Father Bead say the Eternal Father prayer:

"Eternal Father, I offer Thee the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Thy dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world."

Step 4: Sorrowful Passion Prayer

After the Eternal Father prayer, on the ten Hail Mary Beads say:

"For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world."

(Pray Steps 3 and 4 for all five decades).

Step 5: Holy God Prayer

After the 5th decade, say the Holy God prayer, repeated three times:

"Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world."

Step 6: Concluding Prayer

Conclude with the closing prayer:

"Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion — inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is Love and Mercy itself."
