Help us celebrate ANZAC Day at Tony's Café.

This year Anzac Day falls on a Thursday. At Tony's Café, we usually operate on public holidays and on Thursdays the meal is served at 3 pm. However, this year we are planning a lunchtime barbeque instead, in honour of the day.

Could you please help by baking and donating some Anzac biscuits? They are easy to make and would be a welcome addition to the meal.

The Anzac army biscuit is essentially a long shelf-life biscuit, eaten as a substitute for bread.

The biscuits are very, very hard, so some soldiers ground them up to eat as porridge.

This recipe was published in the Capricornian, in August 1926.

Ingredients:

2 cups rolled oats, 1 cup plain flour, ½ a cup of sugar, ½ cup melted butter, 2 tablespoons boiling water, 1 teaspoon golden syrup, 1 teaspoon bicarbonate soda

(add a little water if the mixture is too dry. Method:

1. Combine dry ingredients, 2. Mix golden syrup, boiling water and bicarbonate of soda until they froth. Add melted butter. 3. Combine butter mixture and dry ingredients, 4. Drop teaspoons of mixture onto floured tray,

allowing room for spreading.

Bake in a slow oven. Good luck. Please bag your biscuits, a couple in a bag and write a label with the ingredients. You can drop off on Sunday 21st April at the church, or on Tuesday 23rd April between 9 am and 2 pm at the hall. Many thanks.

NEED TO DISPOSE OF A VEHICLE?

Disposal of a car from a deceased estate, or when a family member has had to relinquish their licence or go into residential care, can be a challenging process. Getting a roadworthy, taking photos to advertise on the internet, cleaning and polishing, taking calls (if they come), even finding a garage until a prospective buyer turns up (if indeed they do!).

If you need to dispose of a vehicle from a deceased estate or which is no longer required, could you consider gifting it to the "Lifeboat Foundation", a registered charity with tax deductible status, which for ten years has been providing pastoral and practical support to nearly 150 victims / survivors across Australia of church -related sexual abuse.

Many of these suffer Post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), and have had limited or no employment., A donated vehicle could vastly improve their quality of life and / or generate much-needed funds to assist personal, medical and accommodation needs.

Dear brothers and sisters in the Risen Lord!

Sometimes I feel envious of the Israelites of two thousand years ago. God was with them in person. They could talk with him, walk and eat with him and could see him face to face. Even after Jesus' death and



resurrection, he continued to show himself to them again and again, making sure they believed and were at peace. They were surely blessed to have been born and lived in that particular time and place.

Jesus called us blessed too, when he declared "blessed are those who have not seen and yet believe". Moreover, the Gospel passage for this Sunday speaks about an apparition of Jesus to many whose names are not mentioned. Probably, we could consider that we ourselves are included among the ones not mentioned, for Jesus does visit us in a number of ways even today.

The ever-living presence of the Lord in the Eucharist is to be acknowledged, and not be taken lightly. It is said that the Angels must be envious of us, for, we can receive the Lord in the Eucharist but they cannot. So, we have no reason to be envious of anyone; yet to have a holy desire to see the Risen Lord face to face and to be able to hear his voice would show how much we really love him. Let's hope and pray that every human person has a loving experience of our Lord! *Fr Leenus*

Good Shepherd Sunday 21 April World Day of Prayer for Vocations

World Day of Prayer for Vocations is on Sunday 21 April. We publicly fulfill the Lord's instruction to, "Pray the Lord of the harvest to send labourer's into his harvest" (Mt 9:38; Lk 10:2).

As a climax to a prayer that is continually offered throughout the Church, it affirms the primacy of faith and grace in all that concerns vocations to the priesthood and to the consecrated life

While appreciating all vocations, the Church concentrates its attention this day on vocations to the ordained ministries (priesthood and diaconate), consecrated life in all its forms (male and female religious life, societies of apostolic life, consecrated virginity, secular institutes), and to the missionary life
