



3rd Sunday of Easter, Year A Emmaus Journey

Dear brothers and sisters in the Risen Lord,

This Sunday's Gospel about the two disciples walking down to Emmaus is a story worth repeating again and again. Their journey was made a memorable one by a "stranger" who joined them and talked with them as they travelled along. The stranger was none other than the Risen Lord himself, though the disciples were kept from recognising him until much later.



Our lives are often compared to a journey, too. We are all on a journey every moment of our lives. Even when we are still or active, awake or asleep, we are moving towards our eternal home. From the time we are born until the time we are gone we are on a pilgrim journey.

This Gospel reminds us that even when we feel that we are on our own, we are not really alone. It was a heart-felt experience for those two disciples to realise, in the end, that God himself walked with them, through their entire journey. In fact the unrecognised Jesus had been explaining to them how God was and still is involved in our entire human history. We may well remember the good old hymn, "*No man is an Island*" because God is with us".

The two disciples were going away from Jerusalem because of their Master's death. The events of Good Friday were too fresh in their memories, and the news about the resurrection they disbelieved. They were disappointed, disillusioned, defeated, discouraged, devastated, depressed, dispirited and in despair and doubt; yet it turned out to be one of the most wonderful walks in history! All because the Lord walked with them.



Their two-hour journey from Jerusalem to Emmaus must have seemed like two-minute journey, being so wrapped up in their absorbing conversation with the Lord, whom they hadn't yet recognised. Only much later they were to realise also that their hearts were burning within them as the "stranger" talked to them.

Jesus is still here. He's the unseen "stranger" walking with us, listening to us and talking with us. If we are willing to hear his voice, he will reveal himself to us. When Jesus intrudes into our lives, probing our thoughts, it is for the purpose of blessing our lives. He wants us to talk to him, not because he does not know anything about what is going on, but because he loves hearing from us.

The Gospel tells us that, "As they approached the village to which they were going, the "stranger" Jesus acted as if he was going further." The disciples then showed their concern for the safety of the stranger, and invited him to stay with them. This concern for their fellow traveller in turn was helpful for themselves. It was now that the stranger breaks the bread and they in turn recognises their Lord and Master as they shared in the Eucharist.

Like the two disciples, let's also invite Jesus to come and stay with us, for "its nearly evening" for u. It's getting dark, do not walk alone; walk with Jesus.

Our Life will never be the same again!
