


Working Bee Garden Tidy Up

Respect: Confronting Violence and Abuse points out that the roots of domestic and family violence "lie in the abuse of power to control and dominate others" and that "this stands in contrast to the relationships to which God calls us".

Our relationships should be "marked by equality and reciprocity rather than domination and violence, respect and freedom rather than coercion and control".

We know that most often those who suffer violence and abuse in homes and families, in workplaces, and in communities, are women and children while the perpetrators are most often men. We support women in calling for respect in relationships; their lives and those of their children are sacred.

Respect: Confronting Violence and Abuse focuses in a special way on the problem of spiritual violence and abuse. It discusses how religious teachings – including our own - may be manipulated by perpetrators to excuse violence or to exert control over others.

Cultural factors in the Church and in society often also play an important role in the violence and abuse suffered in families, households, communities, and workplaces. This behaviour is sinful.

We believe that respect, dignity and justice, transformation and hope are possible. The Statement affirms the work being done by faith communities and organisations to support those who experience domestic and family violence and abuse, and to address the drivers and enablers of violence. It points to further ways in which we can all respond to spiritual violence.

Finally, it calls for faith communities to support and believe those going through domestic and family violence and abuse, to hold perpetrators to account and work towards individual and social transformation.

GOD THE FATHER

Mother Eugenia Ravasio in 1932 received a message from God the Father, entirely in Latin (a language she did not know) The Message ("The Father speaks to His children") is the only revelation made personally by God the Father and recognised as authentic by the Church after ten years of rigorous examinations.



The investigators gave their testimonies, and Msgr. Caillot, one of them wrote "I declare that supernatural and divine intervention seems to me the only logical and satisfactory explanation of the facts. I believe that the hand of God is in all this. After ten years of research, reflection and prayer, I bless the Father for having deigned to choose my diocese as the place for such touching manifestations of His love.



How Mother Eugenia describes the Father

"Having assumed the appearance of an ordinary man by placing His crown and His glory at His feet, He took the globe of the world and held it to His Heart, supporting it with his left Hand. He then sat next to me. I can say but a few words about His arrival and about His appearance. He deigned to assume, and about His love! In my ignorance I do not have words to express what He revealed to me"

God the Father says, I am coming to banish excessive fear that My creatures have of Me, and to show them that My joy lies in being known and loved by My children, that is, by all mankind, present and future.

"The real object of this special feast of God the Father becomes plain: to honour and to thank him,, to praise him for having given us his Son."

"In the Eucharist I live among you as a father with his family. I wished my Son to institute the Eucharist so as to make every Tabernacle the vessel of my favours". work of the third Person, of my Divinity, the Holy Spirit is carried out silently and often people are not aware of it"
