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



22nd Sunday in Ordinary time Year B,

Dear brothers and sisters in Jesus,

We always knew the importance of hygiene, but the ongoing pandemic has taught us to practice it now more than ever before. Similarly, we always knew the importance of rules and regulations that keep us protected, but now more than ever before we have learned to practice them.



What about Jesus, was he a promotor of rules and regulations? Or was he opposed to them and to the customs and traditions like that of washing of hands? Reading the Gospel of today one would think that Jesus was all against them. But didn't he also say elsewhere in the Gospels that he came to fulfill the law and not to abolish them?

He never said that the customs and traditions were altogether wrong. The type of 'washing of hands' Jesus was referring to was not the hygienic type of washing, but ritualistic type. So then, are the 'rituals' wrong according to Jesus? In fact Jesus gave importance to rituals too.

What Jesus opposed was people 'giving undue importance to rituals, customs and traditions, while they neglected matters of eternal importance. Jesus wants us to prioritise our preoccupations. While we carefully give importance to our bodily cleanliness and to worldly rules and regulations, we should also care to practice spiritual cleanliness and spiritual safety. If keeping ourselves away from the virus is detrimental, how much more detrimental is keeping ourselves away from the virus of sinfulness! Jesus seems to say that the best hygiene for us is to practice charity, compassion, righteousness, justice and peace.

There must be millions of customs and traditions through the different cultures in the world. They are to be appreciated and encouraged and even could be adapted unless they are opposed to our Christian faith. Jesus did respect them too. But there could also be customs and traditions that are silly and meaningless, embarrassing and frightening, weird and absurd, harmful and sinful. Keep away from such, as if from Delta variant COVID.

Similarly, there are probably millions of rules and regulations existing in the world of today. All of them may not have the same degree of importance. But if they are of any value at all, then at-least in some indirect way they must be born of the 10 Commandments, the basis of which is 'love'. Pope Francis often reminds us not to be so 'rigid' about rituals and customs and traditions. He wants us to mind the 'spirit of the law', that would make our lives more meaningful and joyful as well.

Keep Safe in every way.
