



Archbishop's Campaign 2024

Dear brothers and sisters in Jesus.

When Jesus first began his work, he did so with an invitation. As he walked along the shore of Lake Galilee, he saw two brothers who were fishermen, Simon and Andrew, catching fish. Jesus invited them to come with him, saying, 'Follow me and I will

make you fishers of men.' At once they left their nets and went with him.

As Jesus went on, he saw two other brothers, James and John. They were in their boat with their father getting their nets ready. Again, Jesus called the men and they at once left their boat and their father and followed him.

As the first disciples responded to Jesus' invitation to 'Come, follow me' and, with him, grow the early Church, we too are called to continue this life-giving work.

Today, we are each invited to make a pledge to the 2024 Archbishop's Campaign in a special collection.

It is an exciting time of renewal for the Church in our Archdiocese. We have vibrant faith communities that are thriving, particularly in the growth corridors of suburban Melbourne. Young people are returning to the Church in growing numbers, and our migrant communities are reimagining what the practice of Catholic faith looks like across our urban, suburban, regional and rural parishes.
